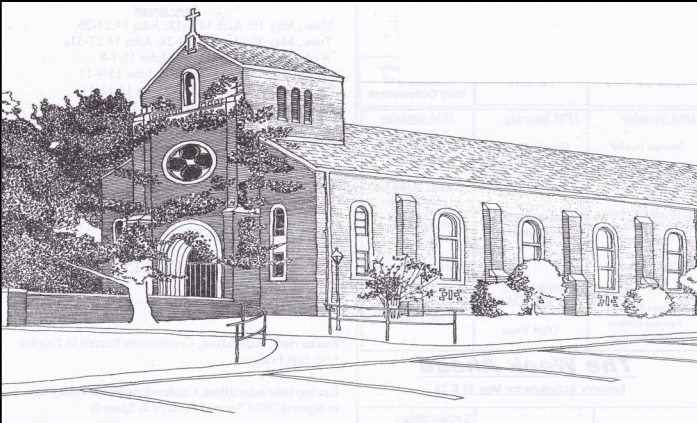

Ash Wednesday, 17th February

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the season of Lent. The ashes we receive on our forehead in the shape of a cross serve as an outward sign of our sinfulness and need for penance. It is a day of fast and abstinence when ashes are blessed and imposed on the foreheads of the faithful to remind them of their obligation to do penance of sins, to seek spiritual renewal by means of prayer, fasting, good works and by bearing with patience and for God's purposes the trials and difficulties of everyday life. The ashes are used to mark the forehead with the Sign of the Cross, with the reminder: "Remember you are dust, and to dust you will return," or: "Turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel."

El Miércoles de ceniza, 17 de febrero

El Miércoles de Ceniza marca el comienzo de la temporada de Cuaresma. Las cenizas que recibimos en nuestra frente en forma de cruz sirven como un signo externo de nuestra pecaminosidad y necesidad de penitencia. Es un día de ayuno y abstinencia en el que se bendicen e imponen cenizas en la frente de los fieles para recordarles su obligación de hacer penitencia de los pecados, buscar la renovación espiritual mediante la oración, el ayuno, las buenas obras y la paciencia. y para los propósitos de Dios, las pruebas y dificultades de la vida diaria. Las cenizas se utilizan para marcar la frente con la Señal de la Cruz, con el recordatorio: "Recuerda que eres polvo, y al polvo volverás", o: "Apártate del pecado y sé fiel al Evangelio".

Dear Parishioners,

Greetings to you all. I hope that you are all keeping safe and healthy.

On last Tuesday which was Groundhog Day the Church celebrated the feast of the Presentation of the Lord which occurs forty days after the birth of Jesus and is also known as Candlemas day, since the blessing and procession of candles is included in that liturgy. Before the revision of the General Roman Calendar this feast marked the end of the Christmas season.

The Presentation of the Lord concludes the celebration of the Nativity and with the offerings of the Virgin Mother and the prophecy of Simeon, the events now point toward Easter. "In obedience to the Old Law, the Lord Jesus, the first - born, was presented in the Temple by his Blessed Mother and his foster father. This is another 'epiphany' celebration insofar as the Christ Child is revealed as the Messiah through the canticle and words of Simeon and the testimony of Anna the prophetess". "The specific liturgy of this Candlemas feast, the blessing of candles, is not as widely celebrated as it should be celebrated, except of course whenever February 2 falls on a Sunday and thus takes precedence. The day after Candlemas is the Feast of St. Blaise. Because St. Blaise miraculously cured a boy who was choking on a fish bone, the intercession of St. Blaise is now invoked against choking, as well as any other ailments of the throat.

The Catholic traditional practice for the day is the blessing of the throats. The rite uses two of the newly blessed candles from Candlemas, tied together in the middle to form a cross, blesses the faithful one by one, saying: "Through the intercession of Saint Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from every disease of the throat and from every other illness: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." These two feasts have their own significance for us especially during these days of pandemic. Any form of blessing is so important for us to protect ourselves from any dangers. As Jesus was offered in the Temple by Mary and Joseph, we offer ourselves to God and seek his divine providence to keep us safe from any form danger and to seek the intercession of Saints and particularly the intercession of St. Blaise to keep us safe.

Estimados feligreses,

Saludos a todos. Espero que todos estén sanos y salvos.

El pasado martes, día de la Marmota, la Iglesia celebró la fiesta de la Presentación del Señor que se produce cuarenta días después del nacimiento de Jesús y también se conoce como día de la Candelaria, ya que en dicha liturgia se incluye la bendición y procesión de cirios. Antes de la revisión del Calendario Romano General, esta fiesta marcó el final de la temporada navideña.

La Presentación del Señor concluye la celebración de la Natividad y con las ofrendas de la Virgen Madre y la profecía de Simeón, los hechos apuntan ahora hacia la Pascua. "En obediencia a la Ley Antigua, el Señor Jesús, el primogénito, fue presentado en el Templo por su Santísima Madre y su padre adoptivo. Esta es otra celebración de 'epifanía' en la medida en que el Niño Jesús se revela como el Mesías a través del cántico y palabras de Simeón y testimonio de Ana la profetisa". "La liturgia específica de esta fiesta de la Candelaria, la bendición de las velas, no se celebra tan ampliamente como debería celebrarse, excepto, por supuesto, siempre que el 2 de febrero cae en domingo y, por lo tanto, tiene prioridad. El día después de la Candelaria es la Fiesta de San Blas. Debido a que San Blas curó milagrosamente a un niño que se estaba atragantando con una espina de pescado, ahora se invoca la intercesión de San Blas contra la asfixia, así como cualquier otra dolencia de la garganta.

La práctica tradicional católica del día es la bendición de las gargantas. El rito utiliza dos de las velas recién bendecidas de la Candelaria, atadas en el medio para formar una cruz, bendice a los fieles uno por uno, diciendo: "Por intercesión de San Blas, obispo y mártir, que Dios los libere de todas las enfermedades de la garganta y de cualquier otra enfermedad: En el nombre del Padre, y del Hijo, y del Espíritu Santo". Estas dos fiestas tienen su propio significado para nosotros, especialmente durante estos días de pandemia y cualquier forma de bendición es muy importante para nosotros para protegernos de cualquier peligro. Como Jesús fue ofrecido en el templo por María y José, nos ofrecemos a Dios y buscamos su divina providencia para mantenernos a salvo de cualquier forma de peligro y buscar la intercesión de los santos y particularmente la intercesión de San Blas para mantenernos a salvo.

Fast & Abstinence: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but not to equal a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

Ayuno y abstinencia: El Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo son días obligatorios de ayuno y abstinencia para los católicos. Además, los viernes de Cuaresma son días obligatorios de abstinencia. Para los miembros de la Iglesia Católica Latina, las normas sobre el ayuno son obligatorias desde los 18 hasta los 59 años. Durante el ayuno, una persona puede comer una comida completa. También se pueden tomar dos comidas más pequeñas, pero no equivalen a una comida completa. Las normas relativas a la abstinencia de carne son vinculantes para los miembros de la Iglesia Católica Latina desde los 14 años en adelante.
