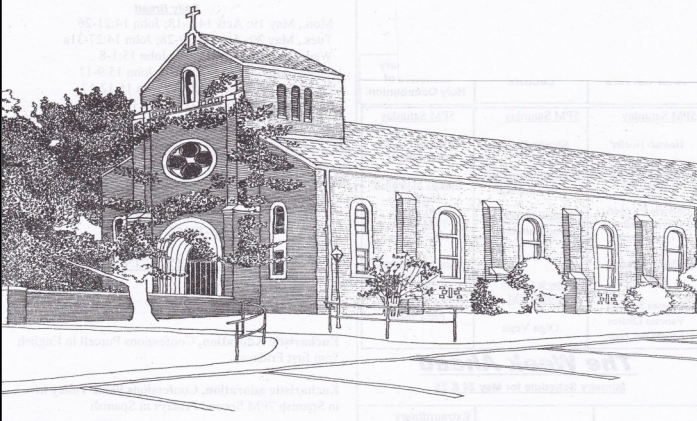

Ash Wednesday, 17th February

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the season of Lent. The ashes we receive on our forehead in the shape of a cross serve as an outward sign of our sinfulness and need for penance. It is a day of fast and abstinence when ashes are blessed and imposed on the foreheads of the faithful to remind them of their obligation to do penance of sins, to seek spiritual renewal by means of prayer, fasting, good works and by bearing with patience and for God's purposes the trials and difficulties of everyday life. The ashes are used to mark the forehead with the Sign of the Cross, with the reminder: "Remember you are dust, and to dust you will return," or: "Turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel."

El Miércoles de ceniza, 17 de febrero

El Miércoles de Ceniza marca el comienzo de la temporada de Cuaresma. Las cenizas que recibimos en nuestra frente en forma de cruz sirven como un signo externo de nuestra pecaminosidad y necesidad de penitencia. Es un día de ayuno y abstinencia en el que se bendicen e imponen cenizas en la frente de los fieles para recordarles su obligación de hacer penitencia de los pecados, buscar la renovación espiritual mediante la oración, el ayuno, las buenas obras y la paciencia. y para los propósitos de Dios, las pruebas y dificultades de la vida diaria. Las cenizas se utilizan para marcar la frente con la Señal de la Cruz, con el recordatorio: "Recuerda que eres polvo, y al polvo volverás", o: "Apártate del pecado y sé fiel al Evangelio".



Lenten Friday's: Prayer is one of the three pillars of Lenten practice. Through prayer, we raise our hearts and minds to God in thanksgiving and praise. During Lent, we place special emphasis on prayer and contemplation on the Passion and Death of our Lord through expressions of popular piety such as the Stations of the Cross and veneration of the Crucified Christ. During Lent the Friday Mass will be at 6pm immediately followed by Stations of the Cross and soup supper served in the Parish Hall at 7pm. Meals are provided by our parish organizations. I am sure that this will allow many people to participate in all the events. Please make use of this opportunity to fulfill your inner desire to participate in the sufferings of Christ on Friday's.

Viernes de Cuaresma: La oración es uno de los tres pilares de la práctica de Cuaresma. A través de la oración, elevamos nuestro corazón y nuestra mente a Dios en acción de gracias y alabanza. Durante la Cuaresma, ponemos especial énfasis en la oración y la contemplación de la Pasión y Muerte de Nuestro Señor a través de expresiones de piedad popular como el Vía Crucis y la veneración al Cristo Crucificado. Durante la Cuaresma, la misa del viernes será a las 6 pm seguida inmediatamente por el Vía Crucis y la cena con sopa servida en el Salón Parroquial a las 7 pm. Dear Parishioners,

Greetings to you from Fr. John Peter Swaminathan. Hope you are all doing well. Wednesday we begin the most important time of the year which is so important for us to begin our Journey to Christ with Fasting, Prayer and Almsgiving which is called the Season of Lent. It is an important time for us to strengthen our relationship with Christ. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Season of Lent that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends with the Celebration of the Easter Vigil. The practice of Ash Wednesday is symbolic within the Catholic Church to recognize our frailty as humans.

Ashes will be sprinkled on our head with the words "remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return". The ash is meant to communicate grief and sorrow over sins and repentance through the death of Jesus Christ on the cross. Ashes are blessed in the Church on Ash Wednesday. They are used to keep us in mind of our humble origin, and of how the body of Adam, our forefather, was formed out of the slime or clay of the earth; also to remind us of death, when our bodies will return to dust, and of the necessity of doing penance for our sins. These ashes are obtained by burning the blessed palms of the previous year. While the ashes remind us that we will die and return to the ground, if we believe in Jesus, we will be raised with him in glorious new bodies.

Ash Wednesday is enriched with rich symbolism. During the Lenten time abstaining from meat on Fridays and one meatless meal a day on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, finds Lent to be a valuable time of abstaining from specific foods, social media, television or other indulgences in order to focus on our need for a Savior and the sacrifice of Jesus. Just as Jesus used fasting and prayer to strengthen his faith during his temptation in the desert, we too can receive power and strength through these practices.

During this Lenten time, I would invite you all to participate in the different liturgies that we have available for you all. We have three masses on Ash Wednesday, and on every Friday we have an evening Mass at 6pm so that many can take part, which is followed by Stations of the Cross and Fish Dinner in the Parish Hall served by members of Knights. May this Lenten Journey be a fruitful one in which you come more closer to the Lord and closer to our brothers and sisters.

Thank You for all that you do to the Church.

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Estimados feligreses,

Saludos de parte del P. John Peter Swaminathan. Espero que estén todos bien. El próximo miércoles comenzamos la época más importante del año y es muy importante para nosotros comenzar este viaje a Cristo con ayuno, oración y limosna que se llama el tiempo de Cuaresma. Es un momento importante para fortalecer nuestra relación con Cristo. El Miércoles de Ceniza marca el inicio del tiempo de Cuaresma que comienza el Miércoles de Ceniza y termina con la Celebración de la Vigilia Pascual. La práctica del Miércoles de Ceniza es simbólica dentro de la Iglesia Católica para reconocer nuestra fragilidad como humanos.

Este año con el Covid, las cenizas serán rociadas sobre nuestra cabeza con las palabras "recuerda que eres polvo, y al polvo volverás" se dice a menudo. La ceniza está destinada a comunicar el dolor y la tristeza por los pecados y el arrepentimiento a través de la muerte de Jesucristo en la cruz. Las cenizas son bendecidas en la Iglesia el Miércoles de Ceniza. Se utilizan para recordar nuestro origen humilde y cómo se formó el cuerpo de Adán, nuestro antepasado, a partir del limo o arcilla de la tierra; también para recordarnos la muerte, cuando nuestros cuerpos volverán al polvo, y la necesidad de hacer penitencia por nuestros pecados. Estas cenizas se obtienen quemando las palmas benditas del año anterior. Mientras que las cenizas nos recuerdan que moriremos y regresaremos a la tierra, si creemos en Jesús seremos resucitados con Él en gloriosos cuerpos nuevos.

Aunque el Miércoles de Ceniza está enriquecido con un rico simbolismo. Durante el tiempo de Cuaresma, abstenerse de comer carne los viernes y una comida sin carne al día el Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo, considera que la Cuaresma es un tiempo valioso para abstenerse de alimentos específicos, redes sociales, televisión u otras indulgencias con el fin de centrarnos en nuestra necesidad de un Salvador y el sacrificio de Jesús. Así como Jesús usó el ayuno y la oración para fortalecer su fe durante su tentación en el desierto, nosotros también podemos recibir poder y fortaleza a través de estas prácticas.

Durante este tiempo de Cuaresma, los invito a todos a participar en las diferentes liturgias que tenemos disponibles para todos ustedes. Tendremos tres misas el Miércoles de Ceniza, y todos los viernes, tendremos una misa vespertina a las 6 pm para que muchos puedan participar en la misa que es seguida por las Estaciones de la Cruz y la Cena del Pescado en el Salón Parroquial servida por miembros de los Caballeros de Colon. . Que este viaje cuaresmal sea fructífero en el que os acerquéis más al Señor y os acerquéis más a nuestros hermanos y hermanas
Gracias por todo lo que hacen por la Iglesia.

Fast & Abstinence: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but not to equal a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

Ayuno y abstinencia: El Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo son días obligatorios de ayuno y abstinencia para los católicos. Además, los viernes de Cuaresma son días obligatorios de abstinencia. Para los miembros de la Iglesia Católica Latina, las normas sobre el ayuno son obligatorias desde los 18 hasta los 59 años. Durante el ayuno, una persona puede tomar una comida completa. También se pueden tomar dos comidas más pequeñas, pero no equivalen a una comida completa. Las normas relativas a la abstinencia de carne son vinculantes para los miembros de la Iglesia Católica Latina desde los 14 años en adelante.
