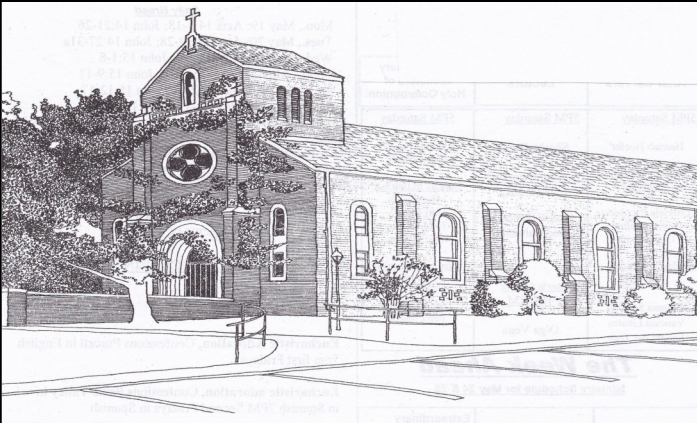

Dear Parishioners,

Greetings to you from Fr. John Peter Swaminathan. Hope you are all doing well.

During every Friday in Lent we gather to participate in the Stations of the Cross remembering how Jesus suffered and died for us. The Stations of the Cross, also known as the Way of the Cross, Via Crucis, and Via Dolorosa (Latin for Way of Sorrows), is a devotion that reflects on Jesus' final days on Earth—from being condemned to death to dying on the cross and being placed in the tomb. The Stations of the Cross consist of a series of 14 artistic renderings that typically line the interior walls of every Catholic Church. These illustrations capture key moments during Jesus' journey to His death on Good Friday. It's often said that you must walk a mile in someone's shoes to understand what they are going through. The goal of this devotion is to "walk" in Jesus' shoes by praying and meditating on each of the events (stations) that Jesus experienced. They involve us in the story: "How many people were with Jesus on the way to Calvary: Pilate, Simon of Cyrene, Mary, the women? Sometimes we can be like Pilate, who did not have the courage to go against the tide to save Jesus' life, and instead washed his hands... The Cross of Christ teaches us to be like Simon of Cyrene, who helped Jesus to carry that heavy wood; it teaches us to be like Mary and the other women, who were not afraid to accompany Jesus. Who are you like? Like Pilate? Like Simon? Like Mary?"

They show us how much God loves us: Jesus led by example and the Stations of the Cross are one of the great many tools for living Jesus leaves for us. By meditating on each of the stations we increase both our sorrow for our sins against God and our need for His help in bearing our own crosses. When we meditate on the Stations of the Cross, we can learn the true meaning of love, perseverance, obedience, humility, and patience.

We have Stations of the Cross at our Church every Friday at 6:30 pm. Come and walk the journey with Christ and know how much he suffered for us and offered himself for us. Let us journey with him and understand his love for us.

Thank You for all that you do to the Church.

Estimados feligreses,

Saludos de parte del P. John Peter Swaminathan. Espero que estén todos bien.

Durante todos los viernes de Cuaresma nos reunimos para participar en el Vía Crucis recordando cómo Jesús sufrió y murió por nosotros. Las Estaciones de la Cruz, también conocidas como Vía Crucis, Vía Crucis y Vía Dolorosa (en latín, Vía de los Dolores), es una devoción que refleja los últimos días de Jesús en la Tierra, desde ser condenado a muerte hasta morir en la cruz y ser colocado en la tumba. Las Estaciones de la Cruz consisten en una serie de 14 representaciones artísticas que típicamente recubren las paredes interiores de todas las iglesias católicas. Estas ilustraciones capturan momentos clave durante el viaje de Jesús hacia su muerte el Viernes Santo. A menudo se dice que debes caminar una milla en los zapatos de alguien para entender por lo que está pasando. El objetivo de esta devoción es "caminar" en los zapatos de Jesús orando y meditando en cada uno de los eventos (estaciones) que Jesús experimentó. Nos involucran en la historia: "¿Cuántas personas iban con Jesús en el camino del Calvario: Pilato, Simón de Cirene, María, las mujeres? A veces podemos ser como Pilato, que no tuvo el valor de ir contra corriente para salvar la vida de Jesús, y en cambio se lavó las manos ... La cruz de Cristo nos enseña a ser como Simón de Cirene, que ayudó a Jesús a llevar ese peso madera; nos enseña a ser como María y las otras mujeres, que no tenían miedo de acompañar a Jesús. ¿Como quién eres? ¿Como Pilato? ¿Como Simon? ¿Como Mary?"

Nos muestran cuánto nos ama Dios: Jesús guió con el ejemplo y el Vía Crucis es una de las muchas herramientas para vivir que Jesús nos deja. Al meditar en cada una de las estaciones aumentamos tanto nuestro dolor por nuestros pecados contra Dios como nuestra necesidad de Su ayuda para llevar nuestras propias cruces. Cuando meditamos en las Estaciones de la Cruz, podemos aprender el verdadero significado del amor, la perseverancia, la obediencia, la humildad y la paciencia.

Tenemos Estaciones de la Cruz en nuestra Iglesia todos los viernes a las 6:30 pm. Ven y recorre el camino con Cristo y conoce cuánto sufrió por nosotros y se ofreció por nosotros. Caminemos con él y comprendamos su amor por nosotros.

Gracias por todo lo que le hace a la Iglesia.

MASS OF THE HEALING AT OLV
Tuesday, March 9th, 7:00 p.m.

Are there any who are sick among you? Let them send for the priests of the Church and let them pray over them, anointing them with the oil in the name of the Lord; and the prayer of the faithful will save the sick man, and Lord will raise them up; and if they have committed any sins, their sins will be forgiven.

The Church receives the gift of healing power from the Lord as one of a list of charisms listed in the Letter of James. Anointing of the Sick is intended to bring about spiritual and even physical effects for those sick persons who approach in faith. Any person who is seriously ill, weakened by old age (even if no serious illness is present), or preparing for serious surgery due to illness may receive the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Each of us are in need of Physical, Spiritual, Mental, Emotional, Psychological healing. On that day there won't be morning Mass but instead we will have the evening Mass in the Church so that many people can take part in the Sacrament of Healing. Come and get healed and anointed.

First Holy Communion- April 17th 2021: This year we will have our parish First Holy Communion on the 17th of April. We will have our regular Saturday Weekend Mass at 5 pm Bilingual in which all the children who are preparing will receive their First Holy Communion. This year we have 12 children preparing. Please be aware of this event so that we give space for the families of these children who are receiving their communion for the first time. We are very happy for them.

Friday Evening Mass, Soup Supper and Stations of the Cross: In order to encourage more people to participate in the liturgies of the Lenten Fridays, I will be having Friday Mass (only during Lent) at 6:00pm, immediately following the Mass, we will have Stations of the Cross in English and a soup supper served in the parish hall at 7 pm, by parish organizations. I am sure that this will allow many people to participate in all the above events. Please make use of this opportunity to fulfill your inner desire to participate in the sufferings of Christ on Friday's.
