Our Lady of Victory, the patron of our Parish. The Church celebrates the Feast of Our Lady of Rosary on October 7<sup>th</sup>. On this day, we celebrate the Holy Leagues defeat of the Ottoman Empire in the battle of Lepanto on October 7<sup>th</sup>, 1571. Even though the Turkish forces were very powerful, the Christians won due to the intercession of Mary and the prayer of the Most Holy Rosary. Our Lady of Victory is also called Our Lady of Rosary. Therefore, it is the Feast of our Parish. Since this year it falls on Thursday, we all cannot come together to celebrate the same, and so, we will have the celebrations on Saturday, October 9<sup>th</sup> at 5 pm. We will have the procession with the statue of the Blessed Mother decorated from the Parish Hall to the Church reciting the Holy Rosary and on reaching the Church we will have the celebration of Holy Eucharist. Following the Eucharist, we will have a fellowship dinner served in the Parish Hall with all the Parish Organizations preparing the meals for everyone.

Dear Parishioners,

Greetings to you from Fr. John Peter Swaminathan. Hope you are all doing well. On Sept. 27, the Catholic Church remembers St. Vincent de Paul, the patron of Catholic charities for his apostolic work among the poor and marginalized.

During a September 2010 Angelus address, Pope Benedict XVI noted that St. Vincent "keenly perceived the strong contrast between the richest and the poorest of people," and was "encouraged by the love of Christ" to "organize permanent forms of service" to provide for those in need. Vincent had initially begun his priesthood with the intention of securing a life of leisure for himself, but he underwent a change of heart after hearing the confession of a dying peasant. Moved with compassion for the poor, he began undertaking missions and founding institutions to help them both materially and spiritually.

Vincent established the Congregation of Priests of the Mission in 1625, as part of an effort to evangelize rural populations and foster vocations to remedy a priest shortage. Not long after this, he worked with the future Saint Louise de Marillac to organize the daughters of Charity, the first congregation of women religious whose consecrated life involved an extensive apostolate among the poor, the sick, and prisoners.

Under Louise's direction, the order collected donations which Vincent distributed widely among the needy. These contributions went toward homes for abandoned children, a hospice for the elderly, and an immense complex where 40,000 poor people were given lodging and work. Vincent was involved in various ways with all of these works, as well as with efforts to help refugees and to free those sold into slavery in foreign lands. In all these works St. Vincent as a priest maintained great personal humility, using his reputation and connections to help the poor and strengthen the Church.

We are grateful to the Members of St. Vincent de Paul who are doing magnificent work in the parish helping out the needy members of the community. I am also most grateful to all those who donate on a monthly basis for the cause of St. Vincent de Paul. Our second collection for St. Vincent de Paul society last month was \$1,872.96. Thank You once again for all that you do for the Parish.

Estimados feligreses,

Saludos de parte del P. John Peter Swaminathan. Espero que estén todos bien. El 27 de septiembre, la Iglesia Católica recuerda a San Vicente de Paúl, el patrón de las organizaciones benéficas católicas por su trabajo apostólico entre los pobres y marginados.

Durante un discurso del Ángelus en el mes de septiembre de 2010, el Papa Benedicto XVI señaló que San Vicente "percibió con gran intensidad el fuerte contraste entre los más ricos y los más pobres" y fue "animado por el amor de Cristo" a "organizar formas permanentes de servicio" para proveer para los necesitados. Vicente había comenzado inicialmente su sacerdocio con la intención de asegurarse una vida de ocio para sí mismo, pero cambió de opinión después de escuchar la confesión de un campesino moribundo. Movidado por la compasión por los pobres, comenzó a emprender misiones y a fundar instituciones para ayudarlos tanto material como espiritualmente.

Vicente estableció la Congregación de Sacerdotes de la Misión en 1625, como parte de un esfuerzo por evangelizar a las poblaciones rurales y fomentar vocaciones para remediar la escasez de sacerdotes. Poco tiempo después, trabajó con la futura santa Luisa de Marillac para formar las Hijas de la Caridad, la primera congregación de religiosas cuya vida consagrada implicaba un extenso apostolado entre los pobres, los enfermos y los presos.

Bajo la dirección de Luisa, la orden recaudó donaciones que Vicente distribuyó ampliamente entre los necesitados. Estos aportes se destinaron a hogares para niños abandonados, un hospicio para ancianos y un inmenso complejo donde se dio alojamiento y trabajo a 40.000 pobres. Vicente participó de diversas formas en todas estas obras, así como en los esfuerzos para ayudar a los refugiados y liberar a los vendidos como esclavos en tierras extranjeras. En todas estas obras San Vicente como sacerdote mantuvo una gran humildad personal, usando su reputación y conexiones para ayudar a los pobres y fortalecer la Iglesia.

Agradecemos a los miembros de San Vicente de Paúl que están haciendo un trabajo magnífico en la parroquia ayudando a los miembros necesitados de la comunidad. También estoy muy agradecido a todos aquellos que donan mensualmente a la causa de San Vicente de Paúl. Nuestra segunda colecta para la sociedad de San Vicente de Paúl el mes pasado fue de \$1,872.96. Gracias una vez más por todo lo que hacen por la parroquia.
