Mass of the Healing Wednesday, November 3rd @ 6:30 p.m.: Are there any who are sick among you? Let them send for the priests of the Church and let them pray over them, anointing them with the oil in the name of the Lord; and the prayer of the faithful will save the sick man, and the Lord will raise them up; and if they have committed any sins, their sins will be forgiven.

The Church receives the gift of healing power from the Lord as one of a list of charisms listed in the Letter of James. Anointing of the Sick is intended to bring about spiritual and even physical effects for those sick persons who approach in faith. Any person who is seriously ill, weakened by old age (even if no serious illness is present), or preparing for serious surgery due to illness may receive the sacrament of **Anointing of the Sick**. Each of us are in need of physical, spiritual, mental, emotional, psychological healing. **On that day there won't be morning Mass but instead we will have the evening Mass in the Church so that many people can take part in the Sacrament of Healing. Come and get healed and anointed.**

Dear Parishioners,

Greetings to you from Fr. John Peter Swaminathan. Hope you are all doing well.

On October 15th the Church celebrates the Feast of St. Teresa of Jesus who was born on March 28, 1515, in Avila, Spain. Her life as a Carmelite, though far removed from the mainstream of modern culture, still speaks powerfully to us today. Teresa longed for a deeper relationship with God, but due to the laxity of convent life in those days, she struggled to reconcile her desire to live for God with other relationships that kept her from devoting herself completely to Him. Repeatedly, Teresa asked God to help her, seemingly to no avail. It was not until 1554 that she experienced the conversion that would mark the rest of her life. Coming upon a statue of the wounded Christ, Teresa was suddenly and intensely moved by what Christ had suffered for her and was overwhelmed by her own lack of gratitude for His sufferings. In tears, she begged the Lord to strengthen her desire to belong to Him, and resolved not to move from there until her prayer was granted. At that moment, Teresa felt a growing strength within her. In prayer, God poured out His love on His daughter, who had become a willing and open vessel as she surrendered totally to her Lord and King. God continued to lead her into the innermost dwellings of her heart, where she beheld the awesome beauty of her King.

The Book of Her Life, The Way of Perfection, The Interior Castle, and The Foundations are her main works, detailing her remarkable pathway to God. It is through these profoundly human yet mystical writings that we experience Teresa's spirit that inspires us to enter into an ever-deeper relationship with God. May the First Woman Doctor of the Church intercede for us to obtain God's special blessings upon us.

Thank You once again for all that you do for the Parish.

Estimados feligreses,

Saludos de parte del P. John Peter Swaminathan. Espero que estén todos bien.

El 15 de octubre la Iglesia celebra la Fiesta de Santa Teresa de Jesús que nació el 28 de marzo de 1515 en Ávila, España. Su vida como carmelita, aunque muy alejada de la corriente principal de la cultura moderna, todavía nos habla poderosamente hoy. Teresa anhelaba una relación más profunda con Dios, pero debido a la laxitud de la vida conventual en esos días, luchó por reconciliar su deseo de vivir para Dios con otras relaciones que le impedían dedicarse por completo a Él. Teresa le pidió repetidamente a Dios que la ayudara, aparentemente en vano. No fue hasta 1554 que experimentó la conversión que marcaría el resto de su vida. Al encontrarse con una estatua del Cristo herido, Teresa se sintió repentina e intensamente conmovida por lo que Cristo había sufrido por ella y se sintió abrumada por su propia falta de gratitud por sus sufrimientos. Con lágrimas en los ojos, le rogó al Señor que fortaleciera su deseo de pertenecer a Él, y resolvió no moverse de allí hasta que su oración fuera concedida. En ese momento, Teresa sintió una fuerza creciente dentro de ella. En oración, Dios derramó Su amor sobre Su hija, quien se había convertido en un recipiente abierto y dispuesto al entregarse totalmente a su Señor y Rey. Dios continuó guiándola a las moradas más recónditas de su corazón, donde contempló la asombrosa belleza de su Rey.

El libro de su vida, El camino de la perfección, El castillo interior y Los cimientos son sus obras principales, que detallan su notable camino hacia Dios. Es a través de estos escritos profundamente humanos pero místicos que experimentamos el espíritu de Teresa que nos inspira a entrar en una relación cada vez más profunda con Dios. Que la Primera Doctora de la Iglesia interceda por nosotros para obtener las bendiciones especiales de Dios sobre nosotros.

Gracias una vez más por todo lo que hacen por la parroquia.
