Dear Parishioners, Families and Friends,

In today's Gospel, Jesus invites us: "Remain in my love" (cf. John 15:9-17). It is so personal that the Lord Jesus remains in us to live with the love that the Father has for him. As Catholics, we are truly blessed to have an opportunity and reminder to remain in his love by participating in the Sacrament of the Eucharist, in which we remain in his Word and in his Body and Blood. Our children whose First Communion is being celebrated reminds us of the joy of being in communion with the faith-filled community in a special communion with the real presence of the Lord Jesus. In addition, the joy of being confirmed in the Sacrament of Confirmation with the beloved disciples reminds us all to continue to serve wholeheartedly His brothers and sisters, even the poor and the needy. Our joy shows our gratitude to all catechists and teachers who have prepared our teens and children for their special sacrament celebrations.

We are also grateful for the opportunity to participate in the 2018 Annual Diocesan Appeal (ADA). In addition to the Diocesan goal, we wanted to raise \$60,000.00:

- Allocate \$10,000 to fund increased spiritual, catechetical, and faith formation for catechists, liturgical ministers, and volunteers through retreats, leadership, and development training, and community building.
- Allocate \$50,000 to continue to build funds for future use of repairing and replacing the church roof, the A/C system and the parking lot. This capital cost is a long term project for which we need to start small building funds.

Peacemakers

Fr. Greg Boyle, SJ, reminds us that this quote from Matthew doesn't say "blessed are the peace-thinkers, or blessed are the peace-feelers" but it says "Blessed are the peacemakers." And that is what it really means. Peacemaker is an active verb, meant for movement. Our movement.

When Fr. Boyle talks about the gang members he works with, he states that he doesn't work with gangs to try to help them get along, he works with gang MEMBERS. They learn how to get along by working side by side with each other in the bakery or the silkscreen shop. He relates the story of two gang members working with each other in the bakery. They were in enemy gangs and one had a tattoo on his face of the other gang member's symbol with it crossed out. He decided to get the tattoo removed and began the process. When he went to the bakery afterward he met the enemy gang member and told him, "I did this because of you. You're good people." God doesn't see differences.

God sees "samenesses." It's not about working out differences because there are no real differences, only sameness.
