May God protect and bless them all, and may those who are no longer with us rest in God's eternal, peaceful embrace!

HOLIDAY FOOD COLLECTION - bins have been placed at the entrance of each church for non-perishable food items, and will be in place until Christmas. Deliveries will be made to local food pantries shortly before Thanksgiving, and just before Christmas. Thanks so much for participating in this corporal work of mercy!

MARRIAGE PREPARATION COUPLES NEEDED! - it would be most helpful and a great service to our local community if there were at least two or more couples from our parishes who would be willing to be trained as leaders in the marriage preparation program used in the Archdiocese. If you have been married for at least three years, are both Catholic, and consider your marriage to be a joyful witness to the Catholic understanding of Marriage and family life, two opportunities for training are being offered - from **January 27 - 29**, and **February 24 - 26**. The exact times and locations will be determined soon - but they will begin with a brief session and light meal on Friday night, will continue on Saturday from 8:30 AM - 5 PM, and the final session will be on Sunday from 1 - 5 PM. **No overnight stay is required** for participation in this training! I sincerely ask that you consider preparing for this important ministry - and if you would like to volunteer and participate in either of these training sessions, please contact me. You will be making a significant difference in the lives of those who are preparing for Marriage!
