On March 13-14, Pope Francis will begin a Lenten prayer project, which he calls “24 Hours for the Lord.” He will preside at a penitential celebration at St. Peter Basilica, and he hopes that parishes worldwide will participate in this project by keeping the church doors open for 24 hours to underline the need for prayer, contemplation of the Eucharist. Beginning with the 9 AM Mass on Friday, March 13, St. Mary of the Rosary will remain open for 24 hours, during which Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and time for confessions will take place.

Later on, it came to mean the remission of a tax or a debt. In Roman law, it was used to express release from captivity or punishment. Its specific use in Church language pertains to the remission of the temporal punishment due to sin, the actual guilt of which has been forgiven, yet the aftermath of which (the “fallout” as it were) still remains.~~

An indulgence is the extra-sacramental remission of the temporal punishment due, on account of God’s justice, to sin that has been forgiven. Such remission is granted by the Church in the exercise of the “power of the keys.” (See Mt 16:17-19) A plenary indulgence is the remission of *all* temporal punishment due to sin such that no further expiation for sin is necessary in Purgatory after death. This requires profound faith as God alone knows what penalty remains to be paid and that penalty’s severity and duration. A plenary indulgence is gained through the performance of a prayer, penance, or good work (spiritual or corporal work of mercy), in addition to the following conditions: one goes to confession soon after the prayer, penance, or good work; one receives Communion in a state of grace; one prays for the intentions of the pope (usually one Our Father, one Hail Mary, and one Glory Be); and one is removed from all attachment to sin (as far as we are able to discern such detachment from sin in our own lives and hearts).

During the season of Lent, there are two common means of gaining a plenary indulgence: praying the Stations of the Cross, and praying before a cross or crucifix. As we are in the midst of the penitential season of Lent, we are invited and encouraged in a particular way to draw closer to the Lord through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. And the faithful actions undertaken to gain plenary indulgences are wonderful ways to experience the Lord’s love and mercy for us.
