First Friday in April

 Friday. The First-Friday devotion is centered in receiv-
 ing Communion (not necessarily in Mass). Everyone
 participating in the First-Friday devotion is encouraged,
 therefore, to attend the Veneration of the Cross service
 that evening at 6:30 PM, during which there will be Ho-
 ly Communion.

Please note that first-Friday confessions at Sacred
 Heart will not take place on April 3 on account of Sta-
 tions of the Cross at 5:30 PM at St. Mary of the Rosary
 in Chewelah. For our complete Holy Week liturgy
 schedule, please look elsewhere in this bulletin.

They can't be weakened by their Easter.

With the Solemnity of the Lord's Passion on Palm Sunday,
 Holy Week begins: a week commemorating the last days of the
 earthly life of Jesus before His crucifixion and resurrec-
 tion. Special liturgies take place during Holy Week that do not
 happen any other time all year. In the Diocese of Spokane, Mon-
 day of Holy Week is when the Chrism Mass is celebrated at the
 Cathedral. So called because the holy oils are consecrated at the
 Chrism Mass and then are distributed to the priests for use
 throughout the year: the Oil of the Sick; the Oil of Catechu-
 mens, and Sacred Chrism. Also at the Chrism Mass, the priests
 gather to concelebrate, and during the Mass, the priests renew
 their ordination promises: celibate chastity, obedience, and sim-
 plicity of life. This Mass begins at 11 AM on Monday March
 30 at the Cathedral. Everyone is invited to attend.

Tuesday and Wednesday of Holy Week are as usual; in our
 parishes these past three years, Holy Ghost has held a Night of
 Adoration, this year beginning after the 5:30 PM Mass and con-
 cluding with Benediction at 6 AM on Wednesday. All are invit-
 ed to spend time with the Lord in the Eucharist during this Night
 of Adoration. Holy Thursday is the Mass of the Lord's Supper,
 and with this Mass, the Sacred Triduum ("three days") be-
 gins. The Mass of the Lord's Supper commemorates the Last
 Supper, concluding not as Mass normally ends (with the priest's
 final blessing), but with a Eucharist Procession out of the church
 to a small chapel or an altar of repose, where the Blessed Sacra-
 ment is kept until Easter.

Good Friday commemorates the Lord's Passion and cruci-
 fixation. Our last Stations of the Cross takes place at 5:30 PM at
 St. Mary of the Rosary, followed by the Veneration of the Cross
 service at 6:30 PM. Good Friday is the *only* day each year when
 there is never a Mass celebrated anywhere in the world. The
 Mass is distinguished by the Eucharistic Prayer, and bread and
 wine are consecrated and made into the Body and Blood of
 Christ. This does not happen on Good Friday because the entire
 day commemorates the death of Jesus. (We fast on Good Friday
 for this same reason). There is Holy Communion on Good Fri-
 day; the Communion hosts are what were consecrated at the
 Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday.

Holy Saturday, in the evening at sundown, is when the East-
 er Vigil begins, and it does not begin as a normal Mass does
 (with the Sign of the Cross) but begins with the blessing of the
 Paschal Candle and the procession into the church. Additional
 Scripture readings are proclaimed in order to narrate the key
 moments in salvation history. The *Gloria* and the *Alleluia* are
 sung for the first time in forty days. Anyone being received into
 the Church (Baptism, Confirmation, and first Eucharist) are usu-
 ally so received at the Easter Vigil.

Easter Sunday concludes the Triduum and begins the Easter
 season with the Sunday celebration and the Easter Octave (eight
