Silver Rose Marian Devotion

School for our ~~Summer of the Week~~ **Summof the Week** Sept. 18 and 19. For more information, call Janet at 935-8648. Our saint of the week this week is St. Bruno, whose memorial is October 9. He was a priest in Cologne, Germany, where he taught theology in the 11th Century for more than 25 years. Through much of his life, he yearned for a solitary life of prayer, penance, and contemplation, and he joined together with several of his friends in a solitary quasi-community life. He settled in the Alps and there founded a contemplative monastic order, the Carthusians, which, legend has it, has never had to be reformed because it was never deformed. Undoubtedly, St. Bruno and his companions would reject such high praise, which is an indication of the saint's love for the penitential life in solitude.

The life of solitude was lived in an oratory in the Alps, which he himself designed and constructed — an oratory comprised of small individual cells at a distance from each other. The companions met for Morning Prayer and Evening Prayer each day but spent the rest of their time in solitude, eating meals together only on feast days. Their primary work as a community was copying manuscripts — this in an age before the printing press was still yet to be invented.

Pope Gregory VII, hearing of St. Bruno's holiness, called for his assistance in Rome, and so it is that St. Bruno's public life was just as praiseworthy as his life of solitude. He advised and supported the pope in his fight against the decadence of the clergy and took part in the removal of his own scandalous archbishop of Cologne. When the pope had to flee Rome, St. Bruno returned once more to private life and spent his final years in the wilderness of Calabria, in the south of present-day Italy.
