parish you belong to. ~~Saint of the Week~~ to PO Box 26, Chewelah, WA 99109. Thank you for supporting your parish group of saints: St. Isaac Jogues, St. John De-Brebeuf, and their companions. They were eight in all, six of them Jesuit missionary priests, who, in the 17th Century, ministered to the Huron tribe of Native Americans but eventually were martyred by the Iroquois and Mohawk Native American tribes in present-day upstate New York, and two lay assistants of the mission who also were martyred. Collectively, they are often known as the "North American Martyrs."

They were French Jesuit missionaries. Facing horrible opposition to the Gospel of Christ, St. Isaac was especially singled out for torture: the thumbs and forefingers of both hands were cut off — in a time when a priest could not celebrate the Mass without these fingers. His torturers were effectively attempting to strip him of his priesthood, of his ability to function as a priest. Left alive, he returned to Europe, and he was given special faculties by the pope to celebrate the Mass without these fingers, and he returned to North America to continue the missionary work that he had begun.

St. John was a French Jesuit who came to Canada at the age of 32 and labored there for 24 years. He went back to France when the English captured Quebec in 1629 and expelled the Jesuits, but he returned to his missions four years later. Although medicine men blamed the Jesuits for a small-pox epidemic among the Hurons, he remained with them. He composed catechism and a dictionary in the Huron language, and he saw seven thousand Hurons converted before he was captured by the Iroquois and martyred after four hours of extreme torture.

Their four priest companions and two lay assistants were also tortured and martyred in much the same fashion, and the eight of them together are celebrated as the first martyrs of the Church in North America, the blood of these martyrs shed as a
