By Heart Catechism

129. What does the indwelling of the Holy Spirit do for man? We are given sanctifying grace, the seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit, and the Theological and Cardinal Virtues. Forming Right Conscience, Part Two
Last week, we began a bulletin column series on "Forming Right Conscience," and we began by exploring why conscience is such an important, delicate, and controversial issue. This week, we explore what happens when a person's conscience is wrong.

If someone's conscience is wrong, does that mean he is off scot-free? The *Catechism* teaches that such ignorance "can often be imputed to personal responsibility. This is the case when a man takes little or even no trouble to find out what is true and good, or when conscience is by degrees almost blinded through the habit of committing sin. *In such cases, the person is culpable for the evil he commits.*" (CCC 1791) Saying that you are acting in accord with your conscience does not protect you from the charge that you are sinning and that you are culpable for doing so. If, through your own fault, you have warped your conscience, then you are still responsible.

But what if your conscience is mistaken but through no fault of your own? If the ignorance is invincible, or the moral subject is not responsible for his erroneous judgment, the evil committed by the person cannot be imputed to him. *It remains no less an evil, a privation, a disorder.* One must therefore work to correct the errors of moral conscience. In this case, you are not culpable for your actions, but they are still evil.

We turn now to how conscience applies to the specific context of Holy Communion, which is an issue raised at the Synod. Prior to receiving Holy Communion, every person needs to examine his conscience, and to respond to this invitation, we must prepare ourselves for so great and so holy a moment. St. Paul urges us to examine our conscience: "Whoever, therefore, eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of profaning the body and blood of the Lord. Let a man examine himself, and so eat of the bread and drink of the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body eats and drinks judgment upon himself." (1 Cor 11:27-29) Therefore, "anyone conscious of a grave sin must receive the sacrament of Reconciliation before coming to Communion." (CCC 1385) This applies to people who are divorced and civilly remarried as much as anyone else.
