A state program provides free brown-bag lunches to youth from the time school gets out until Chataqua. TASTY (Temporary Added Sustenance to Youth) kicks in when the state program concludes.

"The harvest is rich," Jesus tells the seventy-two in today's Gospel, "but the workers are few." The situation is the same today. How can I help with God's harvest? Am I called into the field? Am I one who could provide food or shelter or wages to those who toil in the fields of the Lord?

## Saint of the Week

This week, our Saint of the Week is St. Marianne Cope, whose Memorial is January 23.

St. Marianne is one of the newest American saints. After St. Damien of Molokai died after having contracted leprosy, she effectively took over his ministry. Leprosy scared away most people in Hawaii during the 19th Century. But St. Marianne was inspired with courage to help these poorest of the poor. Her courage helped tremendously to improve the lives of so many victims of such a horrible disease.

Prior to her missionary work, she was born in Germany in 1838 but with her family emigrated to the United States, where she was raised and educated. She worked in a factory in Utica, New York, until 1862, when she entered the Sisters of the Third Order of St. Francis in Syracuse. After her full profession, she began teaching at Assumption school in Syracuse.

Later, she worked in hospital ministry, preparing her for her miraculous work later on in Hawaii. She was elected provincial of her Order and, in 1883, departed for Hawaii with six of her Sisters.

In 1888, she opened a home for women and girls on Molokai, as St. Damien began a home for men and boys. After St. Damien's death, St. Marianne took over his ministry while continuing her own. She changed life on Molokai by introducing cleanliness, pride, and fun to the colony. For her work, she earned state and federal government awards and is even celebrated in a poem by Robert Louis Stevenson.

She never contracted leprosy, despite all odds, and died in her old age in 1918.
