A Message from Father



Happy 4th Sunday,

The Fourth Sunday of Easter is traditionally called the Sunday of the Good Shepherd, and it is also the World Day of Prayer for Vocations. Our Lord, the shepherd who wants to lead us to green pastures if we respond to his call.

St. Peter in today's First Reading explains to his astounded listeners how they can approach and enter into Jesus's flock: through faith in Christ and Baptism. Peter has just concluded his discourse at Pentecost and given testimony to the Risen Christ as Savior to those who believe in him. Baptism is rightly called the "door which gives access to the other sacraments," because it makes us members of Christ, incorporates us into the Church, and makes us share in his mission. It is thanks to Baptism that the Good Shepherd transforms us into his sheep makes us a part of his flock. Peter describes this invitation as a call by God to whomever the Lord wishes. The most

fundamental call is to holiness, to repent and believe in Christ, to be forgiven and to receive the Holy Spirit. Baptism is the first step in leading a holy life. In this sense, everyone has a vocation, and some, like Peter, the Apostles, and our pastors, are called to help us discover and answer the call as well.

St. Peter reminds us that Christ is the shepherd and guardian of our souls and that we are called to follow him by imitating him as well as accepting his guidance and protection. As at Pentecost, Peter speaks of a call by our Lord, and in this reading, he explains what we are called to do: to be patient in suffering for doing what is good, knowing that it is a source of grace and an imitation of Christ.

The Lord doesn't call us to do something that he hasn't done himself. The Shepherd laid down his life for us, his sheep, and he gathers us back into his flock, no matter how we've gone astray. He didn't hand himself over to evil men alone; he surrendered to His Heavenly Father, and the Father did justice for him by raising him from the dead and opening the way to our salvation. Like the Apostles that fateful night of his betrayal, we too were scattered like sheep, but the shepherd and guardian of our souls has gathered together all those who seek his protection and care.

Our Lord teaches us that the only way to satisfy the call to holiness in our souls is through him. The call to holiness is a call to recognize Our Lord as the path and source of holiness.

Our Lord uses the image of sheep who are accustomed to the voice of its shepherd and frightened by the voice of anyone else. The call to holiness strikes a chord in us, and that chord will clash with anything not in tune with Our Lord. Temptation also makes an appeal to our hearts, and Our Lord teaches us today that it will rob us of something if we let it. It is the voice of a stranger and, as our parents always taught us, we don't talk to strangers.

However, in his teaching today Our Lord doesn't identify with the shepherd or the gatekeeper of the sheepfold. He describes himself as the "gate" to the sheepfold. Our Lord is not the only one who wants his sheep; he's just the one who has their best interests in mind. The flock in today's Gospel is already gathered. It is only through Christ that they can be safe in the sheepfold or led to green pastures.

Our pastors are charged to shepherd the sheep, but they can only do that through Christ. If they don't remain united to Christ, part of his flock, they will lead their sheep astray. That is why we celebrate in pray every day we have breath. Pope Pius the V, I believe, promulgated the breviary for the priests to say during the day connecting us with our Lord. It is with great joy we do this and find comfort for each day.

Celebrate with your parish in praying for priests and future priests of the diocese as we serve with a great deal of love. Blessings to you, Fr Jim

Renewal of the Consecration of the United States of America to the Blessed Virgin Mary

May 1, 2020





This prayer of consecration will be offered on behalf of the entire country by the Most Reverend José H. Gomez, Archbishop of Los Angeles and President of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops.

The prayer of consecration incorporates language used in consecrations of Popes Pius XII, John Paul II, and Francis, and also from prayers from Masses of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Use this text to pray along with Archbishop Gomez.

Making the appropriate adaptations, other hishops can use it to renew the consecration of their dioceses, pastors their parishes, and families or individuals their own households.

When prayed in common, a leader might say the parts in bold, and others might read the Scripture passage and lead the decade of the Rosary. The prayer of consecration could be proclaimed by the leader alone or prayed together. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. R. Amen.

INTRODUCTION

When our Risen Lord appeared to his disciples on Easter Sunday he said: "Peace be with you." We can be confident that he desires this same peace for all the members of his body, the Church, and for the people of the entire world.

In this difficult time we turn to the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church and Queen of Peace, to ask that she intercede with her Son for all those who are affected in any way by this pandemic. As we renew the consecration of our country and of ourselves to the Mother of the God, we implore her maternal care for her children.

OPENING PRAYER

Let us pray.
O God, Father of mercies,
whose Only Begotten Son, as he hung upon the Cross,
chose the Blessed Virgin Mary, his Mother,
to be our Mother also,
grant, we pray, that with her loving help
your Church may be more fruitful day by day
and, exulting in the holiness of her children,
may draw to her embrace all the families of the peoples.
Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son,
who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
one God, for ever and ever.

Mary, Health of the Sick, sign of health, of healing, and of divine hope for the sick, we entrust to you all who are infected with the coronavirus.

Mary, Mother of Consolation, who console with a mother's love all who turn to you, we entrust to you all those who have lost loved ones in the pandemic.

Mary, Help of Christians, who come to our rescue in every trial, we entrust to your loving protection all caregivers.

Mary, Queen and Mother of Mercy, who embrace all those who call upon your help in their distress, we entrust to you all who are suffering in any way from the pandemic.

Mary, Seat of Wisdom, who were so wonderfully filled with the light of truth, we entrust to you all who are working to find a cure to this pandemic.

Mary, Mother of Good Counsel, who gave yourself wholeheartedly to God's plan for the renewing of all things in Christ, we entrust to you all leaders and policymakers.

Accept with the benevolence of a Mother the act of consecration that we make today with confidence, and help us to be your Son's instruments for the healing and salvation of our country and the world.

Mary, Mother of the Church, you are enthroned as queen at your Son's right hand: we ask your intercession for the needs of our country, that every desire for good may be blessed and strengthened, that faith may be revived and nourished, hope sustained and enlightened, charity awakened and animated; guide us, we pray, along the path of holiness.

Mary our Mother, bring everyone under your protection and entrust everyone to your beloved Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

As we conclude this consecration, we ask the blessing of Almighty God:

Let us pray.

Bestow the grace of your kindness upon your supplicant people, O Lord, that, formed by you, their creator, and restored by you, their sustainer, through your constant action they may be saved.

And may the blessing of almighty God, the Father, and the Son, * and the Holy Spirit, come down on you and remain with you for ever. R. Amen.]


