A MESSAGE FROM FATHER



Greetings everyone, this is my last official note as your Pastor and kind of sobering,

Today's readings remind us that no matter how in the dark, surrounded, or outnumbered we feel in the face of evil, death, and sin, the Father will stand with us if we stand with him and his Son.

In today's First Reading Jeremiah describes his former friends conspiring against him, but also his confidence that with the Lord at his side all their scheming would fail. Jeremiah had most of the ruling class of Israel against him as the Lord's prophet because they didn't like what the Lord was trying to tell them. Imagine when your friends and countrymen seek your downfall more than your companionship, even when you have their best interest in mind. They have their eyes on Jeremiah, waiting for him to slip up, and that is their mistake. If they'd kept their eyes on the Lord, as Jeremiah did, they would have been spared their fate. Instead, they suffered death or exile at the

hands of the Babylonians, and Jeremiah was vindicated.

St Paul reminds us that even though sin had a head start and plenty of time to spread it was nothing compared to the grace that would flow from one man standing up to it: Our Lord. Because of Adam, the **"one man" mentioned at the start of today's Second Reading, sin and death entered the world and spread to everyone, everywhere, throughout human history.** The dire effects of that Original Sin still rage unchecked in many ways, and no one has a problem seeing the evil that plagues the world even today. It became so bad that it was not even recognized as sin at one point, until the Lord, through Moses, shared the Law (built upon the Ten Commandments) to show mankind how they could turn from sin and back to God and tell good from evil again. I can only imagine we see the tip of such sin and are wanting daily for a sense of peace from the ravages of such sin which we may not even recognize. Even with the Law as a blueprint for life **death still ravaged the world due to sin. Adam could have never made amends for the evil and death he'd caused.**

Good news thou, the Father did not leave him, or us, to our fate. He sent his Son, who wiped away the sins of the world in Baptism and brought the grace of God to us again. Thus, enters the reality of the Church and how we now support and love one another.

Looking at the Gospel Our Lord reminds the Apostles that they only need to stand with him and not be afraid. If we stand with Christ bodily death should not frighten us, because, like him, eternal life awaits us. The only fear we should have is spiritual death: a life separated from him and separated from the Father, which makes life a living death from here to eternity. Trust in Our Lord should embolden us, more than evil and disbelief in the world should intimidate us. We all have moments where we question whether the Lord really knows what is going on or genuinely cares about what will happen to us. His son is the response to those doubts. He came to show us how precious we are in his eyes and the eyes of Our Heavenly Father. He is also our lifeline to the Father.

St. Paul reminds us today that the grace we need comes through him, and that grace not only sustains us in communion with him but with the Father as well. We stand with the Father by standing with Christ, just as we fall if we do not.

WELCOME FATHER PHIL ACKERMAN!



Thank you for the opportunity to introduce myself. My twin sister, Phyllis, and I were born in Grand Forks, ND on April 16, 1952 to Albert and Katherine Ackerman. We are the youngest of four children. Phyllis is 12 minutes older than I am and I often remind her that I look younger than she does! She moved from Grand Forks to Mesa, AZ last year. My oldest brother, Douglas, farmed and lived on our family farm near Reynolds, ND. Recently, he moved to a nursing home in Lakota, ND. The second oldest of our family is Michael. He and my sister-in-law, Betty, are retired and live in Grand Forks. I love to stop by and have lunch or dinner with them when I get to Grand Forks.

Growing up, we worked together as a family on our small farm near Reynolds, ND. As a high school student, I wanted to become a high school teacher, specializing in special education for the deaf. Both my parents were deaf and mute. Our first language was sign language. We are all fluent in sign and communicate easily with deaf people. They even think we are deaf when we talk to them because it was our first language. As children, we spent much time translating for our parents at the implement dealership, grocery stores, fabric shops and neighbors that would come to our home. I found it rewarding to help them. But before my high school graduation in 1970, I attended a youth retreat at Queen of Peace Retreat Center, Fargo. Fr Dennis Schue asked me if I thought about the priesthood! That shocked me! I had my plans! I decided to investigate this. Instead of my previous plans, I enrolled at Cardinal Muench Seminary and NDSU that fall. I wanted to see how it would go for me. Each year was better than the year before. I enjoyed seminary life and studies. Four years later, I was sent by the diocese to St Paul Seminary, St Paul, MN for theology.

I was ordained on June 11, 1978. It was one of the most important days of my life. My first priestly assignment was at **St Mary's Cathedral, Fargo as an associate pastor. Two years later, I was reassigned to St Michael's Church, Grand Forks.** I learned so much in my four years as associate pastor. In 1984, I was appointed associate pastor at **St Joseph's Church, Devils Lake. Perfect! I felt that I could serve there as a priest but at the same time, fulfill my lifelong dream of serving deaf people.** My dad graduated from North Dakota School for the Deaf in Devils Lake. I was well acquainted with the school because I would attend special events there with my parents. I spent time with staff and students at the school. To my surprise, a year later, I was appointed as Diocesan Vocation Director. It was difficult to leave the parish and the School for the Deaf. I moved back to Fargo to serve as Vocation Director full time for 6 years. I was appointed as pastor of Holy Spirit, Fargo in 1991 along with continuing to be part time Vocation Director for 3 more years. My 11 years as pastor of Holy Spirit was such a blessing. I learned about building projects, architects, construction and fund-raising. It was all so new to me as a first-time pastor.

My second assignment as pastor was Holy Family, Grand Forks, ND. More repair projects, facility upgrades, construction and fund-raising. **I also served the mission parish of St Jude's, Thompson. We added a new entrance and gathering space there.** After 12 wonderful years at Holy Family, I was sent to St Alphonsus Church, **Langdon, ND, St Edward's Church, Nekoma, ND and St Michael's Church, Wales, ND. I was assigned for a six-year term.** I assumed that I would be reassigned for a second term. The Lord had other plans.

I am humbled and honored to be appointed as the new pastor of Holy Cross Church. I look forward to serving our parishioners and working with our parish staff, groups, committees and boards.

What are my passions? I will list them: being a priest and having the privilege of offering Mass. Catholic Schools: In my 42 years of priesthood, all my assignments have included a Catholic school! Friends of Chimbote: I am on the board that serves the poor and needy people of Chimbote, Peru. Our goal is to transform lives through **faith and education. The kitchen: I love to cook and bake. I'm not as proficient as Fr Meyer but enjoy cooking a meal and making homemade pies for dessert.**

The pandemic we are experiencing is a challenge for all of us. It makes it difficult to say good-bye to a beloved pastor, Fr Meyer (my distant cousin). It is also a challenging as a new pastor to get acquainted due to social distancing and videoconference meetings. I will do my best under these conditions.

The Lord is there for us. We ask His blessings upon us! I am truly grateful.
