## A MESSAGE FROM FATHER



Who is God?

In today's Gospel (Matthew 16.13-20), Jesus asks Peter, "Who do people say that I am?" Peter's reply is "You are the Messiah."

Even though Peter answered correctly, did he really understand what that truly meant? The Jewish understanding of the Messiah is one who would come to restore Israel to the Jews and drive out the Romans who occupied them. They also expected the Messiah to be a military leader.

**But that didn't happen. Jesus is the Messiah but He allowed himself to die on the cross! What about that understanding of the powerful Messiah who would come to establish an everlasting kingdom? People didn't fully understand Jesus as the Messiah. Even the apostles were confused at times about who Jesus really is.**

Do we understand who God is? He is the supreme being, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. God is more than we can humanly comprehend! Because we have faith in God, it means that we follow Him. In following Him, it means that we have to change our lives. We are to worship Him by coming to Mass and receiving the Sacraments. We are to adore Him. Get to know God even more. It means that our lives must be transformed. It means that having God in our lives makes a difference in how we work and how we relate with others. In doing so, we come to know God more and more.

Jesus Christ is our Redeemer. He comes to save us. He comes to save all of creation. Jesus is the Messiah. He is our salvation. Let us come to know, spend time and worship God more and more in our lives!

Accompanist – The accompanist is responsible to provide accompaniment for the hymns and acclamations during the Mass. Accompaniment skills are required, and knowledge of the Catholic Mass is preferred. *This is a paid position.*

Cantor (Song Leader) - The Cantor is both a singer and leader of the congregational song. The Cantor has the responsibility for any songs or hymns that require solo passages, leading the assembly, and inviting the assembly in hymns and acclamations used throughout Mass.
