A MESSAGE FROM FATHER



Tough News!

I would think that you've experienced that. Receiving bad news or being the one to deliver the bad news. It's tough. It's a part of life. I remember that day in September, 1989 when I was told that my mother had lung cancer. It was serious. I knew she wouldn't get better. I didn't deal with it for two days. I needed time.

In today's Gospel (Matthew 16:21-28), Jesus tells his disciples that He will suffer and die. He told them that he would suffer at the hands of the chief priests, elders and scribes and be killed. Then Peter took Jesus aside and began to rebuke him, "God forbid, Lord! No such thing shall ever happen to you." He turned and said to Peter, "Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle to me. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do."

As human beings, we want the best for others. We don't want people to suffer and die. We want others to live a good life and be filled with happiness. Well, in this world, it is common to face these realities.

But, even in spite of all this, we are people of hope. We know that this tough news is not the end of the story. It continues with a message of Good News! Jesus tells them that after His death, He will rise!

That is our hope as well. When faced with tragic death or terminal illness, we know that Jesus is there to give us new life. But we are not meant to handle this alone. Jesus gives us the gift of the Church. The Church provides us with the Body of Christ to give us strength. We are graced with the other sacraments as we journey on our pilgrim way to eternal glory. Christ is there to give us what we need.

So, in all this, we have hope. When my mother passed away in May, 1990, I knew that she would experience new life. Being deaf and mute all her life, she would be able to hear for the first time and enjoy the choirs of heaven. She would be reunited with her loved ones who left her in death.

We are people of hope. The Resurrection of Jesus Christ is the source of hope. We are filled with gratitude for each day. Whatever we face, we are filled with hope—even when we receive bad news.

What do those roles do??



Accompanist – The accompanist is responsible to provide accompaniment for the hymns and acclamations during the Mass. Accompaniment skills are required, and knowledge of the Catholic Mass is preferred. *This is a paid position.*

Cantor (Song Leader) - The Cantor is both a singer and leader of the congregational song. The Cantor has the responsibility for any songs or hymns that require solo passages, leading the assembly, and inviting the assembly in hymns and acclamations used throughout Mass. The requirements to be a successful Cantor include a strong singing voice, ability to encourage the people to join in the songs and dedication to the ministry of music. Being a Cantor does not require being in any of the choirs. This ministry is open to high school/adult singers.
