The Gifts of the Magi

Today, we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany. What does the word “epiphany” mean? Let’s see what a dictionary has to say about this:

1. a Christian festival, observed on January 6, commemorating the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles in the persons of the Magi; Twelfth-day.
2. an appearance or manifestation, especially of a deity.
3. a sudden, intuitive perception of or insight into the reality or essential meaning of something, usually initiated by some simple, homely, or commonplace occurrence or experience.
5. a literary work or section of a work presenting, usually symbolically, such a moment of revelation and insight.

So there we have it! It is an insight! An appearance! A light in the darkness! We need all that! Jesus was born on a quiet night. Now, it is made public. It is manifested. This is great news for us. We were in darkness. The light has come.

The Magi brought three gifts. Myrrh is used for burial. What a gift for a newborn baby! Jesus comes into the world to redeem us by his death. Frankincense is used in worship services. Its smoke spirals up towards Heaven. Jesus is divine. Gold is a gift fit for a king. Jesus is Christ the King, the King of the universe. I would imagine that people who saw the Magi present these gifts would have been puzzled and wondered why these gifts were chosen.

The birth of Jesus is announced. It doesn’t stop there. We are called to do our part. We are to announce the Good News of Jesus by our words and actions. We are to make this world a better place. The Feast of the Epiphany is a time to reflect on how we bring the Good News into the world.

To celebrate the 150th anniversary of the proclamation of Saint Joseph as Patron of the universal Church, Pope Francis announced that a Year of St. Joseph will be held between December 8, 2020 and December 8, 2021.

Special Plenary Indulgences are granted throughout the Year of St. Joseph, under the customary conditions: Sacramental Confession, Eucharistic Communion and prayers according to the Holy Father's intentions, with a soul detached from any sin. The specific ways the Plenary Indulgence may be gained are listed below.

Year of St. Joseph Special Indulgences

In its Decree on the Year of St. Joseph, the Apostolic Penitentiary granted many ways a *Plenary Indulgences* may be gained. They associated each one with a quality of St. Joseph. The customary conditions (*see other side*) must be satisfied to gain each *Plenary Indulgence*.

A Man of Faith: *Saint Joseph, an authentic man of faith, invites us to rediscover our filial relationship with the Father: to renew our devotion to prayer, to dispose ourselves to listen and correspond with profound discernment to God's will.*

To gain the plenary indulgence: Contemplate the Lord's Prayer for at least 30 minutes or participate in a Spiritual Retreat of at least one day which involves a meditation on Saint Joseph.

A Just Man: *The virtue of justice, practiced by Saint Joseph in an exemplary manner and spurs us to rediscover the value of silence, prudence and integrity in carrying out our duties, is full adherence to divine law,—which is the law of mercy.*

To gain the plenary indulgence: Fulfill a corporal or spiritual work of mercy after the example of St. Joseph.

Guardian of the Holy Family: *Saint Joseph was the guardian of the Holy Family, spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the legal father of Jesus, and inspires all Christian families to recreate the same atmosphere of intimate communion, love and prayer that was lived by the Holy Family.*

To gain the plenary indulgence: Recite the Holy Rosary as a family or an engaged couple.

Worker of Nazareth: *Pope Pius XII instituted the Feast of Saint Joseph the Worker so that "the dignity of work be recognized by all, and that it inspires social life and laws, based on the fair distribution of rights and duties."*

To gain the plenary indulgence: Daily entrust your life to the protection of Saint Joseph and invoke his intercession, so that those in search of work may find employment and the work of all people may be more dignified.

Comfort of the Afflicted: *Pope Francis said that the flight of the Holy Family to Egypt "shows us that God is there where man is in danger, where man suffers, where he runs away, where he experiences rejection and abandonment".*

To gain the plenary indulgence: Recite the Litany to Saint Joseph or some other prayer to Saint Joseph, for the persecuted Church and for the relief of all Christians who suffer any form of persecution.

Patron of the Universal Church: *this year celebrates the 150th anniversary of St. Joseph being named patron of the Universal Church.*

To gain the plenary indulgence: Recite a legitimately approved prayer or act of piety in honor of Saint Joseph. The *Handbook of Indulgences* contains two prayers (the Litany of St. Joseph and "To you, O Blessed Joseph"; they can be downloaded from www.fargodiocese.org/st-joseph) and mentions a third (the Little Office of St. Joseph).

Hope of the Sick: *St. Joseph is comforter of the sick and patron of a happy death.*

To gain the plenary indulgence: The elderly, the sick, the suffering and all those who for legitimate reasons are unable to leave their house, and who with a soul detached from any sin and with the intention to fulfil, as soon as possible, the customary conditions (*see other side*) in their own home or wherever the impediment detains them, shall recite an act of piety in honor of Saint Joseph, faithfully offering to God their suffering and the hardships of their life.
