## A MESSAGE FROM FATHER



Be Healed!

Today's Gospel (Mark 1.40-45) is about Jesus curing a leper. In Jesus' time, leprosy was a dreaded disease and highly contagious. It is still a dreaded disease today. There was no one more pathetic than a leper. People kept their distance from lepers because they did not want to catch the disease. They "socially distanced." Because of the deformities that would happen, lepers were difficult to look at. The disease caused them to be very smelly. People ran away from lepers. Lepers suffered intensely from this terminal disease.

We can learn from what the lepers faced. We all face tragedies: a loss of a loved one; maybe betrayal of a friend or relative; suicide of a loved one; an accident that leaves a loved one permanently impaired; loss of a job; a family member who suffers from addiction. When this happens, we are overwhelmed! We are filled with grief and anguish. We are in shock.

Here is the good news! No tragedy is so bad that we cannot get through it. We can recover. We can pick up the pieces and start over again. Jesus makes this possible for us. Our lives are not ruined forever.

I was so amazed at people who survived the devastating flood of 1997 in Grand Forks. I would hear people say how horrible it was, but they also shared that as bad as it was, the city was transformed. New infrastructure was able to happen. Even with the loss of so much, they experienced new life and they experienced some good things that happened from this tragedy.

Here's what Paul says to the Corinthians: "We are often troubled, but not crushed; sometimes in doubt, but never in despair... and though badly hurt at times, we are not destroyed... For this reason, we never become discouraged." (II Corinthians 4.8-9, 16).

We can be repaired. We can rise again! Our brokenness can be transformed into something more beautiful.

As we begin the Season of Lent on Ash Wednesday, we pray for healing as we carry our Cross with Christ. Let us pray to be healed.

## DISTRIBUTION OF ASHES ON ASH WEDNESDAY

This year, because of the pandemic, the distribution of ashes will be very different. We have been asked to **sprinkle ashes on top of people's heads. No words** will be said. This will prevent physical contact and the use of words that may transmit the virus. These changes minimize the necessity of physical contact between minister and recipient and remove the need for the minister to speak while in close proximity to the recipient. The distribution of ashes by sprinkling is a common practice in some countries but is not **well known here. People's safety and health** concerns are the reason for the change this year.
