A MESSAGE FROM FATHER



“If You Can’t Help A Hundred People, Help One!”

This is a quote from Mother Teresa. It helps us to put things in perspective on how we can be of service to those in need. But on the other hand, it is a challenge for us, too!

Often, we are overwhelmed by the vast numbers of those who need help. There are countless people that go to bed hungry. So many people are homeless—even here in our own community. What can we do to make a difference? It is tempting for us to do nothing because there are so many people that are in need. We think to ourselves, “Oh well, I’m just one person, there is nothing I can do to change this.”

Not so! We are not excused. In today’s Gospel (John 6.1-15), there is a large crowd following Jesus because he was curing the sick. Jesus tests Philip by asking, “Where can we buy enough food for them to eat?” Philip says that not even 200 days wages would be enough money to buy food to feed the crowd. Andrew says there is a boy who has a basket of five barley loaves and two fish. Jesus was able to provide food to feed a crowd of 5,000!

Mother Teresa saw extreme poverty in India. She took all the money she had and rented an old building with a dirt floor. Then she invited children to come and teach them. She had no desks, chairs or supplies. She **fought poverty with what she had and what she didn’t have.**

This is a challenge to us! We cannot feed all the those who are hungry. We cannot provide homes for all those without one. But we can make a difference by helping with what we have. Mother Teresa did that. We can do this, too.

In our own parish, Jackie Schindler and several volunteers have made a difference in serving those who need to be fed. They have worked very hard each week to serve over 200 families! Thanks to Daily Bread and Churches United for the Homeless, too. They deliver food to us to be distributed to those in need. It all started with one person, then a few people which grew into a group of people.

Here is the question for each of us: what can I do? How can I help with the gifts that God has given to me?

If you can’t help a hundred people, help one!

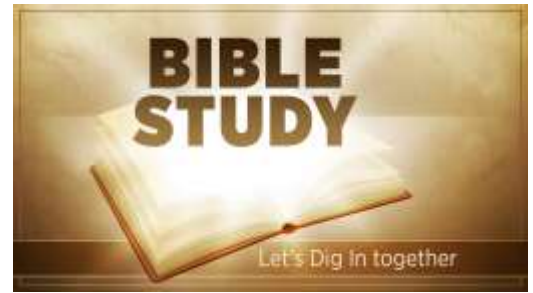

Please have all of your supplies dropped off at Holy Cross by Sunday August 8th!


