OUR OFFERTORY COLLECTION

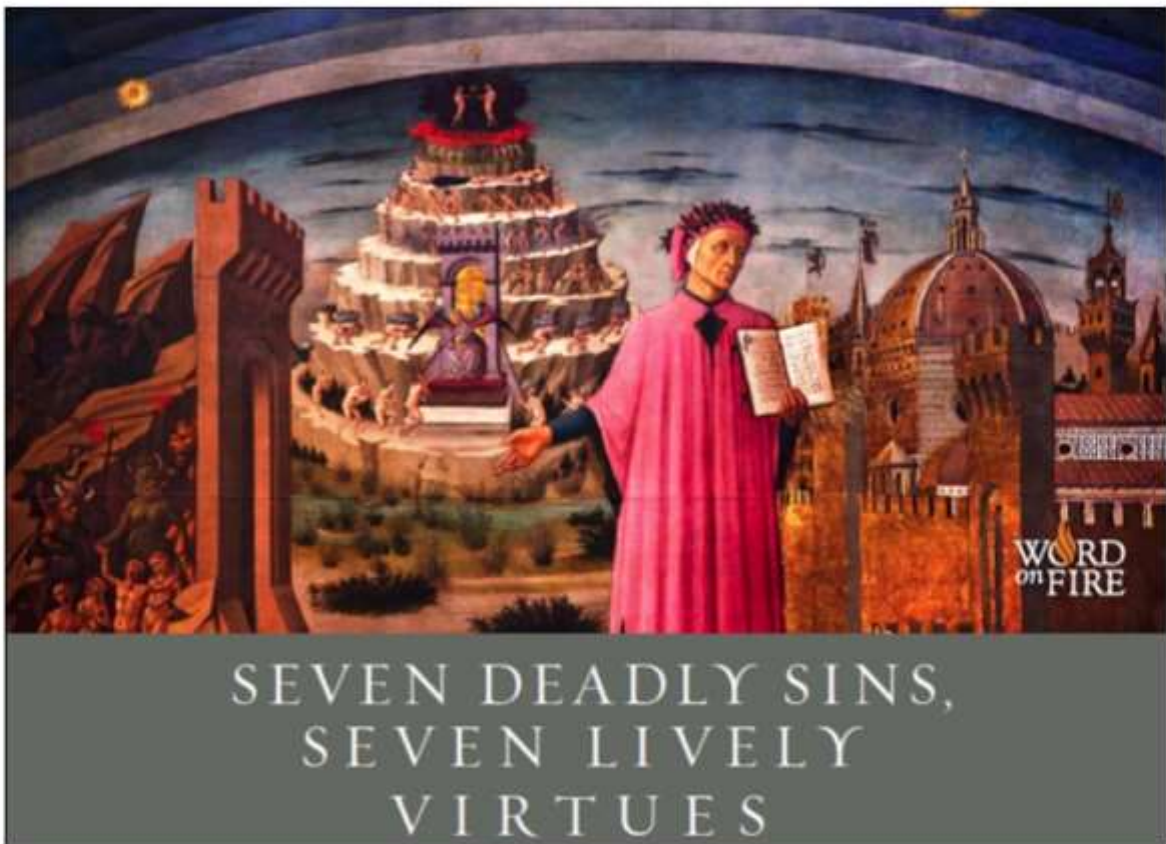

WOULD YOU CONSIDER BEING AN USHER?



Ushers are the primary hospitality ministry at the Masses. Along with the Greeters, they are normally the first representative of the parish that Mass attendees see. Therefore, they are integral to the perception people have of our parish. The Ushers are also an important part of the Mass ceremony. They take up the offertory collection (after COVID), and direct the

Communion procession to ensure an efficient and orderly distribution and make certain that all who wish to receive communion are able to do so. **We ask anyone who is 16 years or older to sign up to be an usher.**

- ◆ We currently have **3747** adult members at Holy Cross (ages 19 & up).
- ◆ Of that **3747**, there are **49** people who have signed up to be an Usher.

We would like to schedule 4 ushers per Mass, to make it all run smoothly, but with the number of people signed up we just can't.
