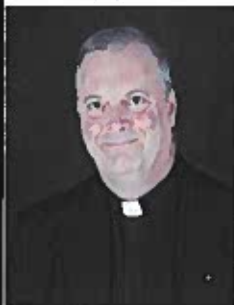

## Once for Sin Once for Glory

One of the other fun things about the Gospel of John is that you can take one phrase and write a whole doctoral thesis on it. John's Gospel is full of great one liners that have layers upon layers of meaning. Such is the case in this weekend's passage when Jesus talks about being "lifted up."

We got a hint of this last week when he told Nicodemus that just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, "so must the Son of Man be lifted up." (Jn 13:14). This week we see it again when he mentions that when he is lifted up he will draw everyone to himself. (Jn. 12:33).

For John, the Cross is the bridge between heaven and earth. This was the moment that changed history forever. Why? Because it was on the Cross that humanity was reconciled to God. This is the moment of glory.

We get hints of this in the dialogue that precedes this statement. Another great theme in John is "this Hour." We get the sense from John that all of Jesus' life will lead up this Hour and all of the grace for the world will flow from this Hour.

Jesus speaks of his death on the Cross as a grain of wheat that once planted, brings forth much fruit. But a seed in the pouch can't do this. It has to "die" in one sense so that it can fulfill its highest purpose.

This has interesting implications for us Christians. We know that we too share in the glory of Christ. If we take John seriously, then that means an essential element of that is to share in his salvific death on the Cross. "Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there also will my servant be." This is how we transcend our own sufferings in this life. We can look at them as pointless misery, or we can see them, like John, as a transcendent sharing in the glory of Christ in his salvific death on the Cross. It really does change everything.

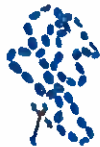

## MUSIC MINISTRY NEWS AND NOTES

Our reflection is from Kelly Dobbs-Mickus, at St. Edmund Parish, Oak Park, Illinois:

"Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world preserves it for eternal life." (John 12:25)

**Reflection**—This cryptic statement is unsettling. Does "hating" life mean we should reject or disdain the people, objects, and experiences in our lives? Or does it rather call us to examine and correct our relationships with them? We have suffered great separation and loss during the pandemic, but we may still cling to destructive or unhealthy attitudes and actions, whether old or newly developed.

Consider Jesus' statement in the context of the other readings, which point to human patterns of relationship with God. Broken covenants are renewed, sinners are reconciled, suffering is redeemed. Through all our human struggles, we can rely on the words of Psalm 51. As you pray them, try to imagine David baring himself to his God, confessing murder and adultery, yet hoping for a forgiveness he doesn't deserve.

Have mercy on me, O God, in your goodness;  
in the greatness of your compassion  
wipe out my offense.

Thoroughly wash me from my guilt  
and of my sin cleanse me.

A clean heart create for me, O God,  
and a steadfast spirit renew within me.

(Psalm 51:3-4, 12)

**Prayer**—May the fruits of our Lenten observance bring us into right relationship with God and each other and make us eager for fitting and beautiful liturgical celebrations of Holy Week and Easter. And may we continually find hope in the God of new covenants.

### SHAKSHOUKA RECIPE – GAZA

Ingredients:

- 3 T fair trade olive oil
- 1 onion, chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, minced
- 1 7oz can green chilis
- 1 28oz can diced tomatoes
- 1 T ketchup
- 2 t salt
- 4 eggs

Heat oil in a large pan. Sauté onions and garlic. Add chilis including juice and cook until soft. Add tomatoes, ketchup and salt. Cook tomatoes down to a sauce. Make four holes in the sauce with a spoon. Crack the eggs into the holes and cover until the eggs cook. Leave yolks runny.

In their 2000 pastoral letter *Responsibility, Rehabilitation, and Restoration*,\* the bishops of the United States called the faithful to embrace an approach to criminal justice that takes into account the dignity of crime victims and their families, communities, and offenders.

The Catholic Home Missions-funded Diocese of Santa Rosa is answering this call for an approach that upholds justice and healing in its six counties of northwestern California, stretching from Napa in the south along the coastline to the Oregon border. The diocese's Catholic Restorative Justice Ministries program ([www.restorejusticesantarosa.org](http://www.restorejusticesantarosa.org)) works to fulfill the bishops' vision through a variety of activities that include support for inmates reentering society, as

well as pastoral ministries for crime victims and their families, justice system personnel, and inmates. The program's broad range of goals are being implemented, expanded, and refined yearly with financial assistance from the Catholic Home Missions Appeal. When you participate in the appeal, you join in the Church's healing mission of mercy to all.

## What Is a Home Mission Diocese?

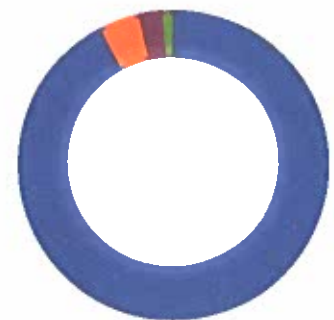

Basic pastoral services include Mass, the sacraments, religious education, and ministry training for priests, deacons, religious sisters, and laypeople. Right now, over 40% of dioceses in the United States and its territories are considered home missions.

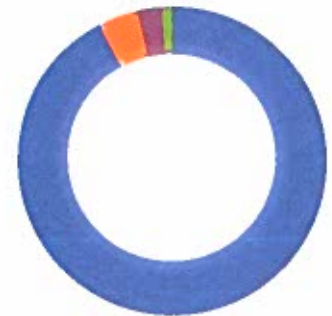
