Tax Tip – Qualified Charitable Donations - We are near the end of the year and tax time is approaching. For Parishioners over 70 1/2 with a traditional IRA, you must take a **Required Minimum Distribution (RMD)** each year. This is normally taxed, but if you take advantage of making a **Qualified Charitable Donation (QCD)** to St. Michael or another charity, you reduce your income by the amount of the donation, thus reducing your taxes. 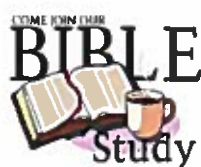

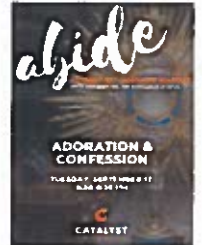
