- Qualified Charitable Donations
We are near the end of the year and tax time is approaching. For Parishioners over 70 1/2 with a traditional IRA, you must take a **Required Minimum Distribution (RMD)** each year. This is normally taxed, but if you take advantage of making a **Qualified Charitable Donation (QCD)** to St. Michael or another charity, you reduce your income by the amount of the donation, thus reducing your taxes. At the parish office we have more detailed information. This information applies to St. Bernard and St. Joseph as well.

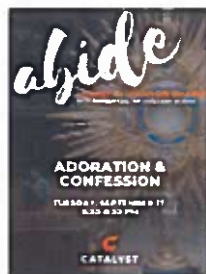

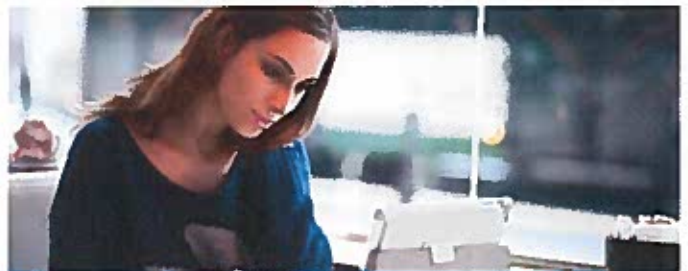
