DIOCESAN PRAYER PROJECT: Among the most important duties of Christ's faithful, prayer occupies an essential place. As such, Bishop Poitras has renewed his request, begun in 2017, that all Parishes take part in a diocesan prayer project. As such, he assigned each priest, permanent deacon & their spouse, men & women religious, mandated pastoral worker, parish & mission, and school throughout the Diocese to devote one day every month to pray for the intention of the Diocese. Each person could

offer their Mass, the Liturgy of the Hours, their rosary, or another form of prayer for this purpose. **The date assigned to St. Anthony's Cathedral is the 13th of every month.** Please remember this intention in your prayer this Wednesday!

CONFIRMATION UPDATE: This is the time we would normally prepare students in grade 7 and 8 to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation and complete their journey through the Sacraments of Initiation. Given the uncertainty of the fourth wave and the fact that the candidates need to meet in small groups for their formation as well as do community outreach, we have decided to postpone a decision about preparation until January 2022. PUBLIC ROSARY: To mark the 104th anniversary of the apparitions of the Blessed Virgin at Fatima, all are invited to a public recitation of the rosary **next Saturday**, (October 16th) at noon at Hollinger Park. This gathering is part of a global "Public Square Rosary Rally."

MASS AT ST. MARY'S GARDENS: We have received the green light to resume weekly Mass at St. Mary's Garden. Mass will be at **2:00 P.M. each Tuesday**. At present, due to covid restrictions, Mass is only open to residents of the building.



FIRST RECONCILIATION & FIRST COMMUNION UPDATE: Each year we invite students in grade 3 and older to prepare to celebrate the Sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Communion. After consultation with the various people (i.e., the Parish preparation team, school personnel, and others in pastoral ministry), we have decided to move forward with preparation this fall, with all the necessary covid protocols in place. Letters will be going home to students at Pope Francis Catholic School late next week and registration dates will be announced next week in the bulletin.

Seven Points of the Classic Kerygma

Many of us have fallen victim to the popular sentiment that the basic proclamation of Christ is somehow backward, too simple and basic for a modern audience to accept. Nothing could be further from the truth. The early Church understood that if those on the outside of the Church were going to understand Jesus Christ, they would need to first hear the basic message of why Christ came, the problem that he solved, and how to be a part of his amazing plan of sheer goodness. This proclamation was called the kerygma.

Kerygma is a Greek word which means "preaching" but refers more specifically to the first preaching of the Apostles as they went out after Pentecost. Kerygma is also translated as "message" and the early Church understood this to mean the basic foundational proclamation of Christ, his mission, and our response.

Hidden in the seven points of the classic kerygma is the secret of restoration, healing, and wholeness. (The Activated Disciple: Taking Your Faith to the Next Level (Ascension Publishing, 2018), page 114)
