**FOCUS ON THE READINGS:** Sunday, January 16<sup>th</sup> : *God intends to make each one of us a new creation in Jesus Christ.*

Isaiah encourages the people, giving them hope for the future and reminding them of God's love for them. We can take encouragement from these same words, especially since Christ has come for us. The Lord longs to breathe his divine life into each of us, making us new and whole.

**CONNECTING TO THE GOSPEL:**

In the first reading, Isaiah sings a litany of praise to the nation of Israel, foretelling its future glory, fulfilled in the person of Jesus. God makes Israel's land "his spouse", signifying a relationship come to fruition. Ultimately, the church becomes Christ's bride, an image confirming our relationship to Jesus Christ.

In today's gospel, Jesus performs his first miracle, caring for the celebration of a wedding attended by many in the community. A first glimpse at the Lord teaching us about caring for each other. Yet he does not seek recognition for his contribution whatsoever.

God grants many gifts given by the Spirit, how do you use yours? Do you share or contribute to the well being of others without expecting to be glorified?
