This proclamation, this confession of trust in the all-powerful love of God, is especially needed in our own time, when mankind is experiencing bewilderment in the face of many manifestations of evil. The invocation of God's mercy needs to rise up from the depth of hearts filled with suffering, apprehension, and uncertainty, and at the same time yearning for an infallible source of hope." St. Faustina and Divine Mercy Sunday

St. Faustina was born in Poland in 1905. At the age of 20 she joined a convent in Warsaw. One of her early acquaintances was to become Pope John Paul, now St. John Paul. She had many visions of Jesus and conversations with him which she noted in her diary, later published as the Diary of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska: Divine Mercy in My Soul. She was commissioned by Jesus to create the Divine Mercy portrait with rays of red and white representing his blood and water. Divine Mercy Sunday was established by St. John Paul and is the Sunday following Easter.



Divine Mercy Chaplet Using Rosary beads

Begin with: Our Father, Hail Mary, The Apostles Creed
One the large bead before each decade say:
*Eternal Father,
I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your
dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our
sins and those of the whole world.*

On the ten small beads of each decade:
*For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on
the whole world.*

After the last decade, recite the following prayer three
times:
*Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy
on us and on the whole world.*
