LITURGY AND LIFE

Many people today let social conventions stand in the way of seeing the suffering and needs of people around them. When a person sees a dirty, injured person asking for money, oftentimes his or her first thought is not about how the injured person is suffering or what the injured person needs, but is instead something more along the lines of, "Why are they asking me for money?" In this passage, Jesus provides an example to the contrary. Jesus is not concerned with the bleeding woman or the dead girl making him dirty, but is instead focused on healing the brokenness that is plaguing these females. Like Jesus, we should not let their concern for how society will view them, or the social conventions of their culture, keep them from meeting the needs of those around them.

Saint Thomas the Apostle

One of Jesus' original Apostles, commonly known as doubting Thomas. He travelled outside of the Roman Empire to preach the Gospel. He arrived in modern day Kerala in India in 52AD. There he established seven churches and baptizing many prominent families. Many sources confirm his travels as far as to China. Once he returned to India, he was threatened with attack, so traveled to the Malabar Coast. Here he continued preaching and ordained several teachers and leaders of the church. He was martyred in 72 AD. His tomb is in Mylapore, India
