LITURGY AND LIFE

In today's Gospel, Jesus encounters a man who wants to belong to God, to inherit eternal life, but who is unable to let all of his security rest in God's promises. We are challenged to consider how much our faith lies in God and how much in our possessions. St. John Chrysostom taught that refusing to share wealth with the poor is the same as stealing from them. Discuss that statement with your faith community or a friend. What does it say about the righteousness of the man who spoke with Jesus? This week, give something you need to the poor.

St. Teresa of Jesus – St. Teresa of Avila Friday, October 15th

St. Teresa of Jesus, also known as St. Teresa of Avila, was born on March 28, 1515, in Avila, Spain. Her mother died when she was 14, and she entered the Carmelite Monastery in Avila in 1535. Coming upon a statue of the wounded Christ, Teresa was suddenly and intensely moved by what Christ had suffered for her and was overwhelmed by her own lack of gratitude for His sufferings. During a long period of illness, St. Teresa developed a love for mental prayer. In 1562 she opened the first convent of the Carmelite Reformed. Despite ill health she opened another 16 convents in Spain before her death in 1582
