As you can probably gather from the title of this bulletin article it's that time of year once again—to raise funds for the Catholic Services Appeal Foundation (CSAF). This is a tremendously important form of outreach that we offer in solidarity with our brothers and sisters throughout the Archdiocese and beyond. There are twenty ministries that will be recipients of the CSAF this year that include scholarships for Catholic education, pro-life causes, hospital ministry, and the Venezuelan Mission where I had served for three years before coming to Immaculate Conception.

From personal experience I can attest to the impact that the CSAF has on the lives of those who are in need. Thank you very much to those who have contributed in the past. Last year we had 186 parishioners/families that supported the Catholic Services Appeal Foundation with \$28,819 in total donations. This year our goal is 200 donors and \$33,621 from the Immaculate Conception parish family. We'll have the official "Commitment Weekend" in one week but I wanted to take the time today to let you know about what's coming up and to thank you for your generosity. 

## The Road to Discipleship

### Recognize God in Your Ordinary Moments

When I was a child, I often thought of the Church as something mystical and supernatural. I wasn't wrong in my understanding of the Body of Christ, for surely the Church has these characteristics. However, even though we speak about the foundation of all we are as Church being the "mystery of Christ," Jesus became a man so that supernatural element could break into the natural world in a profound way. What we once could not see, we now see. What we saw as a God in a distant place now dwelt among us. It is one of the aspects of Catholicism that I have grown to appreciate the most as I have matured: for a Catholic, the supernatural is natural. The communion of saints is heavenly and earthly at the same time.

The Beatitudes instruct us about this reality. Pope Francis reminds us that holiness is "not about swooning in mystic rapture." Holiness is about living in the real world and doing extraordinary things with our ordinary lives. Our stewardship way of life consists of actions in the natural world that have extraordinary repercussions.

Do not ever take your simple actions of generosity and love for granted. As disciples called to a life of stewardship, we participate in something more profound than what we can see. We are blessed to be called to follow Jesus, and we bring blessing to all those with whom we choose to share ourselves.

### An Hour with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament

Join the Faith Formation families as we spend an hour with Jesus on Wednesday, February 20, 7:00 - 8:00 pm in the church. What will happen during this hour? First, Father James will take a sacred host from the Tabernacle and place it in a monstrance (special vessel for displaying the host), on the altar. As Catholics, we believe that Jesus is fully present in the reserved host which was actually transformed into the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus during Mass. Once on the altar, Jesus will be with us in a very real way. We will sing to Him and spend quiet time with Him. We will listen to scripture, and maybe hear a witness of God's love. We will bask in His presence!

So think about it. If you have an hour with Jesus, what would you want to do? What would you want to tell Him? It could be an hour to thank Him and just love Him as He loves you back! It could be an hour to rest, to ask for peace, be refreshed and give Him your cares. Jesus said, *“Come to Me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest.”* (Matthew 11:28)

During the hour Fr. James will be available for Reconciliation. The evening will end with refreshments in the narthex area. Bring a friend!

## Why Do We Do That?

### Catholic Traditions Explained

**Question:** *I’ve noticed that when I go to Mass at different parishes, sometimes people say and do different things. Why is that?*

**Answer:** The Mass in its current form has taken shape over the course of 2,000 years. Over time, traditions, structures, and prayers have been put into place. There are certain rubrics for the Mass that are normative wherever you go. This means you could attend Mass in Malawi or Thailand or Italy and still watch the same basic liturgy unfold, even if you don’t understand the language. There may be some cultural differences from place to place, things that aren’t specifically listed. For example, in the United States most people go up for Communion in a nice neat line. In Europe, everyone gets up around the same time. It’s a bit of a free-for-all!

Some people might take it upon themselves to change things individually. People may not like something that feels too “liberal” or “conservative,” and they may take a well-meaning stance in the opposite direction. When people (including the presiders) do things that are distracting or change the liturgy, it introduces an element that breaks the unity of the assembled community. The important thing to remember is that we gather as the Body of Christ to celebrate the Eucharist. If you are confused, ask! If you are frustrated, pray for the spirit of charity.

## Live the Liturgy—Inspiration for the Week

Getting ahead in the world is something many see as important. Success, a comfortable life, and worldly securities are seen as what is needed to achieve happiness. Whether or not we like to admit it, these pursuits are operative in many of our lives. As much as we want to believe in the Gospel, we also find it hard not to cling to these other things. Unconditional trust in God must be first if we are going to perceive the kingdom of God. And while God does not want us to go out of our way to be miserable, Jesus clearly gives preference to those who are poor, hungry, weeping, marginalized, vulnerable, and despised. When people encounter these things, they touch God. It teaches us not to get too comfortable with our riches and that there is much more to true life than the stuff we find so important.

# Gospel Meditations

## Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

What an audience Jesus has in today's Gospel! "A great crowd of his disciples and a large number of people from all over Judea and Jerusalem and the coastal region of Tyre and Sidon." Disciples, pagans, and devout Jews gathered together to hear Jesus speak in the Sermon on the Mount. All of these people had something in common. God was someone to be bargained with, and if God liked you, you were rewarded with good fortune. This Sunday, Jesus tells us a different story. "Woe to you who are rich ... who are filled now ... who laugh ... when all speak well of you. Blessed are you who are poor ... you who are now hungry ... when people hate you and when they exclude you and insult you." Jesus completely flips the script on what it means to be blessed by God. What he proclaims as "woe" are states of life we often strive for, and "blessed" are the states we work hard to avoid!

Jesus is concerned with the kingdom of God and the world to come, not the typical structures of power and privilege. The word "now" appears often in these statements. Why? If you are well "now," that's beside the point. To be rich in this life has no direct bearing on your immortal soul. If you're struggling "now," that's not an indication that God has forgotten you or that—in light of eternity—you're worse off than someone else. In fact, it could be an indicator that you're enduring something that will bring you to a place of greater, eternal joy in the future.



This Sunday, consider your priorities. Who do we reject as not blessed, and thereby inflict woe upon ourselves? When we encounter difficult situations in our own lives, do we see them as opportunities to remember God and lean on His mercy and grace?
