A PALM SUNDAY TO EASTER SUNDAY COMPANION

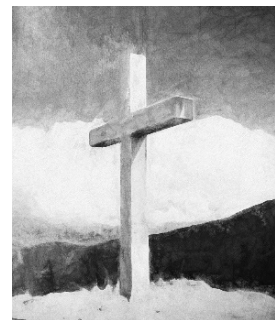
A most special week

For Christians, Holy Week is the most important week of the year. Holy Week lasts from Palm Sunday until Easter Sunday and reaches its highpoint in what we call the Easter Triduum – those three great days from the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper to Evening Prayer on Easter Sunday. Reflecting on the Scriptures and turning to ritual and symbols, Christians throughout the world, journey with Jesus through those final days of his life, his passion, his death and resurrection. In the process, we experience God's redemptive presence, our faith is deepened, our hope is renewed and our commitment to living a life of love of God and one another is strengthened.

A different way of praying as a community of faith

Again this year, our celebrations will be very different due to the restrictions in place because of the Covid-19 Pandemic. As a Christian Community we cannot gather together for our usual religious services. This will not prevent us from uniting spiritually and taking time to pray, to reflect and to make this Holy Week a truly enriching experience of the presence of God in our lives. Some suggestions for Keeping Holy Week



Create a sacred space in your home for the week. It can be as simple as a candle and a bible. You can add particular **symbols for given days, palm on Palm Sunday, a water bowl & towel on Holy Thursday, a cross on Good Friday, a candle and holy water for Easter Sunday.**

Take time each day for prayer: Join in a livestream liturgy from your parish / use the daily prayer ritual in *Bringing Holy Week Home 2021* on Kandle.ie or the Kandle Facebook page / read the readings of the day and go out for a walk as you reflect on them.

Visit your local parish church for some private prayer and a physical connection with your parish

This is the right time to propagate your snowdrops. Lift the clump, separate the bulbs carefully, replant in your designated area an inch or two apart. Cover with soil and firm them in. Water them immediately, even if rain is due. Please allow dandelions to bloom and grow. They are a very valuable source of food for our pollinators when little else is available to them.

CHRISM MASS

This year's Chrism Mass can be viewed via the Kildare and Leighlin Facebook page and iCatholic livestream. We are delighted to be able to share video greetings from our parishes from 7:10pm, with Mass beginning at 7:30 pm. Please join Bishop Denis for this celebration of the diocesan family. At the Chrism Mass the Bishop blesses the Oil of the Sick and the Oil of Catechumens and consecrates the Oil of Chrism. These oils will then be used in parishes throughout the diocese during the year.

I urge parents to help children (especially our young children preparing for Confirmation and First Holy Communion) to make a Cross out of wood and place it in the front garden of your home.

PALM SUNDAY PRAYER

Pause for a few moments to become aware of God's presence and pray:

Loving Father, with palm branches we recall when Jesus was welcomed by crowds into the city of Jerusalem. Bless us with your Spirit as we prepare to journey through Holy Week. May we find time to listen again to the story of the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus. There, may we discover the love of God, which knows no bounds. We bring with us our suffering and pain, our worry and loss and the suffering, pain, worry and loss of the whole world at this time. May we hear proclaimed this coming Easter Day that Jesus is risen! May we have our hope renewed in God who brings good out of bad and even life out of death. Amen

HOLY THURSDAY

Mass of the Lord's Supper will be celebrated in our church at 7pm via webcam

Gather with members of your household if you can. Place a jug of warm water, a bowl and a towel in or near your sacred space. Parents might act out 'the washing of feet' with their children and explain to them the reason behind this tradition. The washing of feet is a symbol for washing away all our faults – the hatred we harbour in our hearts – a way to cleanse away our faults.

Take time on Holy Thursday to sit down together for a family meal but before you eat explain the importance of Holy Thursday and remember the meal that Jesus shared with his disciples. It is important to point out that families must work

together and that every person has a role to play. Families must share things and must look after each other. Our parents work to provide everything for their family. It is important that children can help out around the home – they can do small jobs ie. Set the table / empty the dishwasher/ tidy their rooms/ help put out the bins etc.

GOOD FRIDAY

Please join us via webcam for The Stations of the Cross at 12noon and The Passion at 7pm and Prayer Around the Cross from 8pm to 8.30pm.

I ask parents to help their children make a Crown of Thorns and place it on the Cross in the garden or in your sacred space. The Crown of Thorns symbolises our pain and suffering in this life. As a family you might consider sacrificing a meal today to join with our brothers and sisters who struggle every day because of hunger. I suggest that as a family you might take the Palm Cross with you and go for a walk and reflect on the Stations of the Cross and how Jesus loved us so much he gave his life for us.

EASTER SUNDAY

Please join us via webcam for the Easter Vigil on Saturday evening at 7.30pm or Easter Sunday Mass at 10am.

During Lent we made promises to change our life for a new beginning. Remember our promises that we made before Jesus and light an Easter Candle and ask God to help us carry out our promises in our everyday lives.

As you are aware we normally renew our Baptismal Promises during the Easter ceremonies. This year I ask you to join with me and renew your Baptismal Promises at home – after the blessing of water. If you have some holy water please bless yourself after you renew your Baptismal Promises.

Renewal of Baptismal Promises

Celebrant: My dear brothers and sisters through the Paschal Mystery we have been buried with Christ in Baptism, so that we may walk with him in newness of life. And so, now that our Lenten observance is concluded, let us renew the promises of Holy Baptism, by which we once renounced Satan and his works and promised to serve God in the holy Catholic Church. And so I ask:

Priest: Do you reject Satan?

All: I do

Priest: And all his works?

All: I do

Priest: And all his empty promises?

All: I do

Priest: Do you believe in God, the Father Almighty, creator of Heaven and Earth?

All: I do

Priest: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was born of the Virgin Mary, was crucified, died and was buried, rose from the dead and is seated at the right hand of the Father?

All: I do

Priest: Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the Holy Catholic church, the Communion of Saints, the forgiveness of sins, the Resurrection of the dead and life everlasting?

All: I do

Priest: This is our faith. This is the faith of the Church. We are proud to profess it, in Jesus Christ our Lord.

All: Amen

EASTER WATER

You are invited to leave an empty bottle with your name on it into the church porch and Fr. Bernard will fill them and bless the water as part of our Easter Vigil on Saturday night. People can call back and collect them after Easter Sunday Mass – they will be left near the altar.

CANDLES

You are also invited to leave in a candle with your name on it and Fr. Bernard will bless them along with the Pascal candle at our Easter Vigil Mass. These will also be available for collection after Easter Sunday Mass.
