The Answer to the following question comes from "The Catholicism Answer Book."

A book of the 300 most frequently asked questions by Rev. Father John Trigilio, Jr., PH.D., TH.D. and Rev. Father Kenneth Brighenti, PH.D. Authors of the best-selling book, "Catholicism for Dummies."

Question 14 – What are the "lost" or "missing" books of the Bible?

Answer – The so-called "missing," "lost," or forbidden" books of the Bible are the many writings which no Jewish or Christian group has ever considered inspired text. Only books considered divinely inspired have the guarantee of inerrancy (freedom from error). Most of these "lost" text were written two to three centuries after the apostles were long dead and buried and their authorship and authenticity are greatly disputed.

The Protestant tradition calls these books in the Old Testament Pseudepiqrapha, from the Greek meaning "false" writings, in contrast to what they label Apocrypha, meaning "false" writings in contrast to what they label Apocrypha, meaning "hidden" writings. The Catholic Bible calls these lost books deuterocanonical.

Some examples of Pseudepigrapha (Protestant)/Apocrypha (Catholic) would be the books of Adam and Eve, Apocalypse of Moses, book of Enoch, Apocalypse of Adam, Apocalypse of Abraham, Martyrdom of Isaiah, Testaments of the Twelve Patriarchs and the book of Jubilees.

What Protestants call Old Testament Apocrypha, Catholic and Eastern Orthodox call deuterocanonical: Baruch, Maccabees 1 and 2, Tobit, Judith, Ecclesiasticus (Sirach), and Wisdom. These seven books, plus some chapters in Daniel and Esther, are always in the Old Testament of Catholic Bibles and usually found in Protestant Bibles listed as Apocrypha.

In the New Testament, both Catholic and Protestant traditions merely use the term Apocrypha for the books left out which were never considered divinely inspired, like the Gospel of Thomas, Gospel of Philip, Gospel of James, Gospel of Nicodemus, Gospel of Peter, Death of Pilate, Acts of Andrew, Acts of Barnabas, Passing of Mary, History of Joseph the Carpenter, Apocalypse of Peter, the Revelation of Paul, and the infamous Gnostic Gospel of Mary Magdalene. These texts were never included in any Bible. Rather than classifying them as lost, missing, or even forbidden, most Christians simply call them

Third Sunday in Ordinary Time Today's Readings: Jonah 3:1-5, 10; Psalm 25:4-9; 1 Corinthians 7:29-31; Mark 1:14-20

THE TIME IS SHORT

A sense of urgency is reflected in all of today's readings. Jonah warns the Ninevites, "Forty days more and Nineveh shall be destroyed." Paul reminds the Corinthians that "time is running out." Jesus proclaims that "this is the time of fulfillment." There is no denying that we humans tend to respond more readily to an urgent request; we seem to be much more motivated by something that must be done right now. This tendency makes it all too easy to put off less urgent things: "Oh, we've got time for that later."

For the people in Jonah's day, for the people of Jesus' time and Paul's time, the end was believed to be imminent. The words of the prophets and reformers frequently tried to evoke a sense of urgency.

We don't know, of course, how much time we have as individuals or as nations to reform our ways, but it's safe to say that there's less time left today than there was yesterday. Today's readings may be inviting us to revise our priorities. 
