## **GREAT NEWS:**

### ***Overflow Mass attendees can view Mass in the Memorial Center Gym***

***We have increased the number of sign ups for the Saturday Vigil and Sunday Masses to 125 per Mass. The Church cannot hold that many with Social Distancing guidelines but now the Mass will be live streamed in the Memorial Center Gym. The gym will be open for people (practicing social distance) to watch the Mass live and receive communion. If there is no space in the Church you will be asked to go to the Gym. To follow the guidelines of the State of California, Yolo County and our diocese, our church can only hold up to 100 people at a time. With the Gym option we can accommodate more people. The same protocols will be followed in the Gym as in the Church. (See below).***

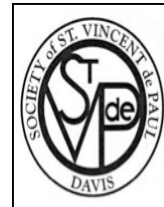

**April 18, 2021– Third Sunday of Easter**

*In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus explains the meaning of the scriptures to the disciples he meets on the road to Emmaus. Like the disciples, when we offer and receive forgiveness and use our hands and minds to help others, our hearts burn because we encounter the risen Christ within us.*



Bishop Robert Barron writes, "From the outside, the Church's charitable work might look a lot like social work. The difference is not only in the motivation but in the mystical animation. Behind the corporal and spiritual works of mercy is the reality of Christ continuing his work in and through his Mystical Body, the Church. Certainly, even an atheist of goodwill can serve the poor. But when a Christian serves the poor out of a deep sense of identity with Jesus Christ, the arms and eyes and hands of Jesus are mystically at work in the world." The Gospel calls us to affirm the dignity of each person as created in God's image. The Society of St. Vincent de Paul is concerned not only with responding to acute needs of food and shelter, but also identifying the cause of human suffering. Our St. James members join with other Vincentians throughout the diocese to identify ways of alleviating human suffering as a systemic issue. Consider answering the call to "help the poor find forgiveness and healing in their life" by joining us in our work for economic justice for those in need. Currently, the St. James SVdeP Conference meets remotely on Zoom, but any interested parishioner is invited to join us. **NEWS FROM THE IRWS**



Greetings friends,

As supporters of the Interfaith Rotating Winter Shelter, thank you for your great care and compassion for the unsheltered in Davis. This organization's legacy will be recognized as the rock on which emergency shelter programs for individuals living homeless in Davis was built.

For 13 winters IRWS provided shelter, hot meals, and a friendly face to hundreds of guests. The heartfelt work of the thousands of IRWS volunteers will always hold a proud place in the history of the Davis community.

In recent years, IRWS has discussed ways in which emergency services to the homeless community could be expanded. The advent of COVID19 last year meant that IRWS could not function as it has in the past and a new program was needed.

In the past year IRWS worked hard to secure funding and has been fortunate to receive several grants. These funds have allowed IRWS to hire paid staff to help run our program. A non-congregate setting was necessary, and a local apartment owner gave us access to 25 two-bedroom apartments at a significantly reduced rental rate. In partnership with the City of Davis, CommuniCare, DOVe, and Yolo Food Bank, the Davis Emergency Shelter Program (DESP) was created. Beginning in October 2021, this program has sheltered up to 39 individuals at a time and has moved some participants into permanent housing.

Someone remarked, "I have always thought of IRWS as a program with heart." And so, we present to you our new name, HEART of Davis. HEART is for Homeless Emergency Assistance and Re-Housing Team. Our new mission statement is: *Assist people experiencing homelessness in the Davis community to obtain shelter, housing & supportive services.* Our vision is to establish a year-round non-congregate emergency shelter, provide support services, and assist those who are looking for housing. Thank you again for all your many years of support, compassion, and friendly faces. We hope you will continue to support our new program.

## RANDOM THOUGHTS AND PRAYERS BY DEACON SAM

--“Walk by faith, not by sight.” Are we brushing up against Jesus, or, are we really touching Him with our hearts, our faith, our hopes? Are we living discouraged, disappointed regretful, or, are we determined to love and know God better by our faith? Can our faith be seen? Can we stir up the gifts and talents God has put in each of us? Can we praise God for His goodness? We have all experienced countless miracles in our lives which we may not always recognize – or appreciate. A secret to happiness is to live each moment thanking God for all He has given to us and done for us from each beat of our hearts and breath we take, the joy of a sunrise, the caress of a gentle breeze and the people who share our life. Our faith makes us whole. Be persistent in prayer, thanksgiving and the certainty that God loves each of us very much.

--Believe in Jesus.

Receive the gift of salvation that He offers us.

Walk in the light of the Lord.

--We want to get back to “normal” –to meet with our families, socialize with friends, go to restaurants, etc., but we are cautioned to keep social distance, wear masks, get vaccinated, take care of ourselves and respect others. Some self-centered people choose not to listen to the words of caution – their minds are like concrete – firmly set and not moveable. May we keep our minds and hearts open to the care and respect of others during this time of pandemic, trust in God to help us patiently manage the tension in our lives which we may be experiencing, and not forget to daily thank God for His goodness.

--There are people who assume that if they have wealth, status and power they can ignore the needs of others. Some people think that if they have money, God is on their side. Those who have privilege were given this by God to help those in need. Sadly, we can be enslaved by self importance, materialism, addictions, etc... Enslavement, however, is not what God wants for us – He wants people to live in freedom. He doesn’t want arrogance to be used to destroy people. We are all sons and daughters of God given the opportunity each day to grace the world with Christ – like humility, mercy, love, graciousness, tenderness and compassion. May Christ be our priority, our light and our guide.

--It is easy to lose our passion for life when we are tired, or hurt or when we have lost our perspective. Perhaps, then, it is time to open up the windows in our being and let the light shine in – exercising, eating healthy, getting enough sleep, praying and thanking God for His goodness are all excellent. This day – and every day – is a gift from God. Celebrate the small successes in your life and stay determined to keep moving forward. Let God work in the silence of our hearts – and listen to Him.

--The desire for God is a fundamental appetite for us humans. We may at times feel abandoned by God – but God is always with us, always loving us, always inviting us to choose Him above all else, always helping us find joy and peace in His grace and mercy. God works in mysterious ways – all of us have certainly heard this at one time or another. With faith in God, difficult times, such as this ongoing time of pandemic, can form us. God uses events and adversities to bring us closer to Him. True faith is trusting in God when it makes no sense to do so – to really believe that God is there for us and really knows what He is doing. Keep faith that God knows what is best for us.

--Pause. Listen to the voice of God in our hearts and in our heads. Pray that we may experience the presence of God more fully in our lives and that our thoughts and actions may be more pleasing to Him. God listens when we pray – may God ignite in us an abiding confidence in a future with hope.

--“Nobody Knows the Trouble I’ve Seen – Glory Hallelujah”

This is a magnificent African-American spiritual song sung over the years by such vocal greats as Marion Anderson, Paul Robeson, Lena Horne and Louis Armstrong. It reminds us that Jesus underwent the sufferings we go through – only deeper. I think that self sufficiency (thinking that we can do it all) can be a sin. The opposite of self sufficiency is despair. I believe that we have the ability to solve great problems on this planet by submitting to God and working with each other. The reality of our life with Jesus is His Spirit, His greatness and His grace. Working together we can become “merciful warriors” and make a profound difference with our lives. We can choose to glorify ourselves – or to glorify God. God is calling us to glorify Him by our making a difference in this world.

--“When you do the right thing, you are never wrong.” Mark Twain

Integrity is the foundation on which a successful life is built. If we were standing next to God, what might we be thinking? Perhaps, it wouldn’t be to think about how much I could get away with. Rather, we might choose to be a person excellence and integrity – kind, considerate, honest, trustworthy and respectful of everyone. Let our actions flow from our hearts. “Lord, give us grateful hearts so that we can be loving, merciful and compassionate to everyone around us.”

--The Resurrection of Christ gives us hope, gives us strength. Christ is with us and with Him we have life. God controls the universe – He has the solution to our problems long before we are even aware of having a problem. May we all live in faith. Dinner at the table of the Lord is not complete without any of us there. There is a seat waiting for each of us. Praise God!

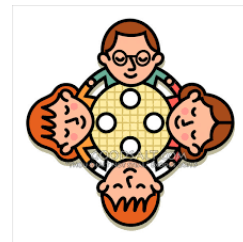
