Message from Father Steve,

Today is a day of celebration for many reasons. Certainly, gathering to worship our Lord is in-deed a celebration! We also begin our final week of the Lenten season today, as Palm Sunday marks the Holy Week's beginning. And we especially feel excited to recognize that it is on this day when we remember Christ's return to Jerusalem from the desert in which he spent forty days in iso-lation and temptation. In Zechariah 9:9, we read: *"Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion! Shout aloud, O daughter of Jerusalem! Behold, your King is coming to you; righteous and having salvation is he, humble and mounted on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey."* To those of you who join us reg-ularly and to those of you who are joining us for the first time (or the fifth time, as the case may be), rejoice! Our King is coming to us, and salvation is ours through Him. *evil. Amen.*

While the people were praising and offering shouts of approval, he knew that soon those same people would be shouting "crucify Him" a few days later. Their thought was that at long last, the Messiah had come, and they would soon be able to overthrow the Romans, and the Kingdom of the Messiah would be established. Jesus knew this was not the time. That time is still to come and is a time none of us would want to miss "for the world." We gather here today to be the Passion of Jesus. Yes, Mass will be longer today; the pain our bones may experience pales compared to the suffer-ing of Jesus. As we begin the Holy Week journey, let us take a moment to pray that God will speak to all our hearts in a unique way but also as a corporate and united body. **Fr. Steve**

Entering and Dying. This Holy Week begins with a festive entry into Jerusalem with cloaks spread around, with leafy branches waving, and with "Hosannas" crying out. But this all ends with suffering and death.

- How will spend this day and this week emptying myself as Jesus did?
- How can I, like Jesus, be more humble?
- How will I be obedient? ?

RESPECT LIFE

"Jesus gave a loud cry and breathed His last."

In the Pas-sion of Our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark, the culmina-tion of the liturgical year leads us to Holy Week, where Jesus by dying, destroys our death and by rising, restores our life. Life is a gift of inestimable value and the rigors of the pas-sion show us how much Christ loves and values each human life. He gives His life for us; we are to give our lives for one another. **Learn, Act, Connect and Pray-** many current issues demean the same human life that Christ loves and are being trampled underfoot. Rejection of human life is a rejection of Christ. (The Gospel of Life n.104) One of the most vulnerable: the unborn baby of an underage mother in Illinois, frightened and planning an abortion until she has a supportive talk with her parent/ guardian through the Parental Notification Act, now up for repeal in Illinois. The law is credited with saving more than one thousand babies a year and many of the young mothers stay in school and finish with help from their fami-lies. Those who are victims of sex trafficking or prostitution, can be saved by that phone call, revealing where their missing daughter is. Also we hear of a rise of anti-Asian violence and discrimination across our nation. According to the Center for the Study of Hate and Extremism at California State Universi-ty, incidents of anti-Asian hate and bias increased nearly 150% in 2020. These are just two examples. We must know the issues and continue the work necessary to advance the values of life, equity and inclusion for all God's people.

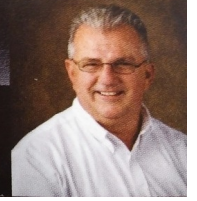

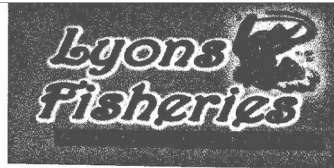
