St. Joseph's Cemetery Association was formed in 1927. The purpose of this association is to provide a dignified final resting place to members of St. Joseph Parish, direct descendants and family members. The association's intention is to provide continued improvements to cemetery grounds and monuments, preserve historical information, and to maintain perpetual care funds.

Cemetery Rules & Regulations

The following guidelines have been created in order to maintain the dignity of this final resting place. Therefore, all maintenance within the cemetery grounds is reserved for authorized personnel only. The Association is authorized to enforce these rules and may remove any items unsightly or deemed inappropriate. The Cemetery Association accepts no responsibility to save or replace any such articles which have been removed or damaged. Maintenance crews are not responsible for any damage to decorations beyond the stone footing. The Association is not responsible for theft or damage to anything placed on the grave sites. The Association shall not be held liable for any injury to persons or property which occurs on the cemetery premises regardless of cause. Thank you for your cooperation.

Please respect and honor all of the following:

- Decorations are allowed beginning Easter Sunday and must be removed by October 1st
- One decoration per grave
- Live plants should be confined to pots and placed in holes located in grave footings
- Artificial decorations must be secured to grave stones
- Shepherd's hooks must be placed into pre-drilled holes in cement footings
- Only USA flags for Military Veterans are permissible during appropriate times
- Funeral floral arrangements or personal items may be left on the grave for two weeks after interment; unless they pose a health, safety, or maintenance hazard
- Service dogs are allowed – owners are responsible for immediate waste removal

What's Prohibited

- Pets
- Trees and shrubs
- Glass containers, flower boxes, can-style tripods, or other items deemed unsightly
- Grave blankets
- Toys, balloons, figurines, candle and solar lights
- Motorized vehicles including, but not limited to: snowmobiles, 4-wheelers, gators, and motorcycles
