A Father Looks Back.... Long time country music singer Kenny Rogers has a song called Water and Bridges, which highlights a father's pain after losing a child to abortion. Rogers told CNN that the song is not about him, but is "really about choices you make when you're young that you pay for when you're old." He goes on to explain, "It starts off with a young couple who have an abortion, and the guy says, 'If a father could hold his son, I could undo what's been done, but I guess everyone is living with water and bridges.'" Men's Group Moment.... "The Didache - one of the oldest writings outside the New Testament - describes the ancient practice in which the priest, just before distributing Holy Communion says: 'Whoever is holy, let him approach, whoever is not, let him do penance' (Didache 10). The Church has always stressed this perennial doctrine and discipline: before one receives Jesus Christ in Holy Communion one must be in communion of life, restored often by God's mercy in the Sacrament of Penance. Otherwise, instead of receiving all the graces from Holy Communion, we are partaking of our own condemnation. St. Paul declared, 'Whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord unworthily will have to answer for the body and blood of the Lord.' In other words, whoever unworthily receives the Eucharist will have to answer for the Lord's death." [Paragraph #61 of Apostolic Exhortation, Veneremur Cernui - Down in Adoration Falling]

New Lighthouse Talks CD...."An Unshakeable Kingdom—Living the Virtue of Hope" by Dr. Tim Gray. "We live in a time of fear; it's palpable in our culture." In the wake of the Covid-19 pandemic, Augustine Institute President Dr. Tim Gray reflects on and illuminates our ever-present need for theological hope. Turning to the Word of God in Scripture and the wisdom of Pope Benedict XVI, Dr. Gray exhorts that no matter the time, place, or circumstances of life, Christians must remember that we are made by God for eternal life. "We cannot despair in a plague, or an economic depression...what can shake our hope, if our hope is in heaven?" Stop and pick up one in the entry of the churches. Cost: \$4.
