Stewardship Thought.... Good stewards must not argue about who is the most important. Today's Gospel says clearly that those who aspire to greatness must humbly serve the needs of all. Even Jesus came not to be served, but to serve. Have you given real thought lately to how good God has been to you? Do you give in proportion to what God has given you?

The CARES Act (Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security) created 2 temporary changes to the tax treatment of charitable donations. For the 9 out of 10 people who no longer itemize their charitable giving, the CARES Act allows taxpayers to deduct donations to our Church of up to \$300 on their 2021 federal tax return even though they take the standard deduction. Married-filing jointly taxpayers will get an above-the-line deduction of up to \$600. For more information, contact your tax preparer.
