Stewardship Thought....Today's Psalm says, "The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy." Good stewards demonstrate by their living and giving that they understand God as the Source of all they are and have. The heart grateful to God needs to find a way to express that gratitude. Some important ways to do that are through prayer, through service and through giving of one's resources.

The CARES Act (Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security) created 2 temporary changes to the tax treatment of charitable donations. For the 9 out of 10 people who no longer itemize their charitable giving, the CARES Act allows taxpayers to deduct donations to our Church of up to \$300 on their 2021 federal tax return even though they take the standard deduction. Married-filing jointly taxpayers will get an above-the-line deduction of up to \$600. For more information, contact your tax preparer.

Be a Man: Becoming the Man God Created You to Be For Thursday, October 28: we will begin the workbook portion for Chapter 4, "Be a Man Who Lives in the Holy Spirit." All men are invited to join. We meet from 6:30 to 7:30AM in St. John's dining hall.
