Guidelines for Mass Intentions

We have received several inquiries regarding Mass Intentions. Below are the guidelines from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB):

Mass Intentions may be said for:

1. A deceased loved one.
2. A living person who is sick.
3. A living person who is celebrating a birthday, anniversary or other special moment in their life.
4. In Thanksgiving to God (including the Lord Jesus or the Holy Spirit).
5. In Thanksgiving for a prayer from a Blessed or a Saint.

Mass Intentions may not be said for:

1. An unknown or "private" intention.
2. A prayer Intention that contradicts Catholic moral doctrine.
3. Politics or political figures.

One Mass Intention per Solemnity is designated by the Pastor as "pro-populo" or for the people either for the parishioners, or a segment of the Parish community (i.e. youth, the sick, children, families, etc...)

Please keep our First Communion candidates in your prayers, they will be making their First Reconciliation on Monday, January 25th at 5:30 PM.



Feast of St. Blaise, February 3, 2021

The Blessing of Throats will be a little different this year because of the pandemic. Instead of individually blessing throats, we will change to a general blessing. After the homily, the celebrant—without candles—extends his hands over the assembly and says the prayer of blessing.

February 2, Mass and Blessing of throats at Saint Mary's at 6:00PM.

February 3: Noon and 6:00PM (Bilingual) at Sacred Heart.

Masks are required when attending mass and other functions at Sacred Heart and St. Mary's. A Message from Archbishop Hartmayer

Like many of you, I cannot wait until we have the COVID-19 pandemic behind us. However, now more than ever, we cannot let down our guard. We are seeing rising infection rates including a growing number of cases among our priests and deacons. We wanted to remind you of our current protocols and review some guidelines for moving forward.

Everyone attending a parish event must wear a mask and stay 6-10 feet away from others not in their family group. Wearing masks is an act of the virtue of charity. It prevents us from infecting others. Thank you for being so considerate.

Other than liturgies, parishes cannot host gatherings of more than 50 people at a time. Social events, including receptions, are still not advised in parish facilities.

We encourage all priests, deacons and ministers to get a vaccine when it is available to your age and health group. I consider you essential workers in the vineyard of the Lord and want you to stay safe and healthy. However, even after you receive both doses of a vaccine, you will need to continue to wear a mask, practice social distancing and keep your hands clean until health officials in our communities determine conditions are safe once again.

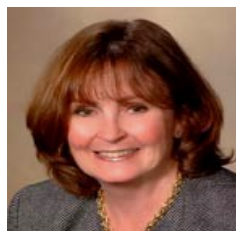
