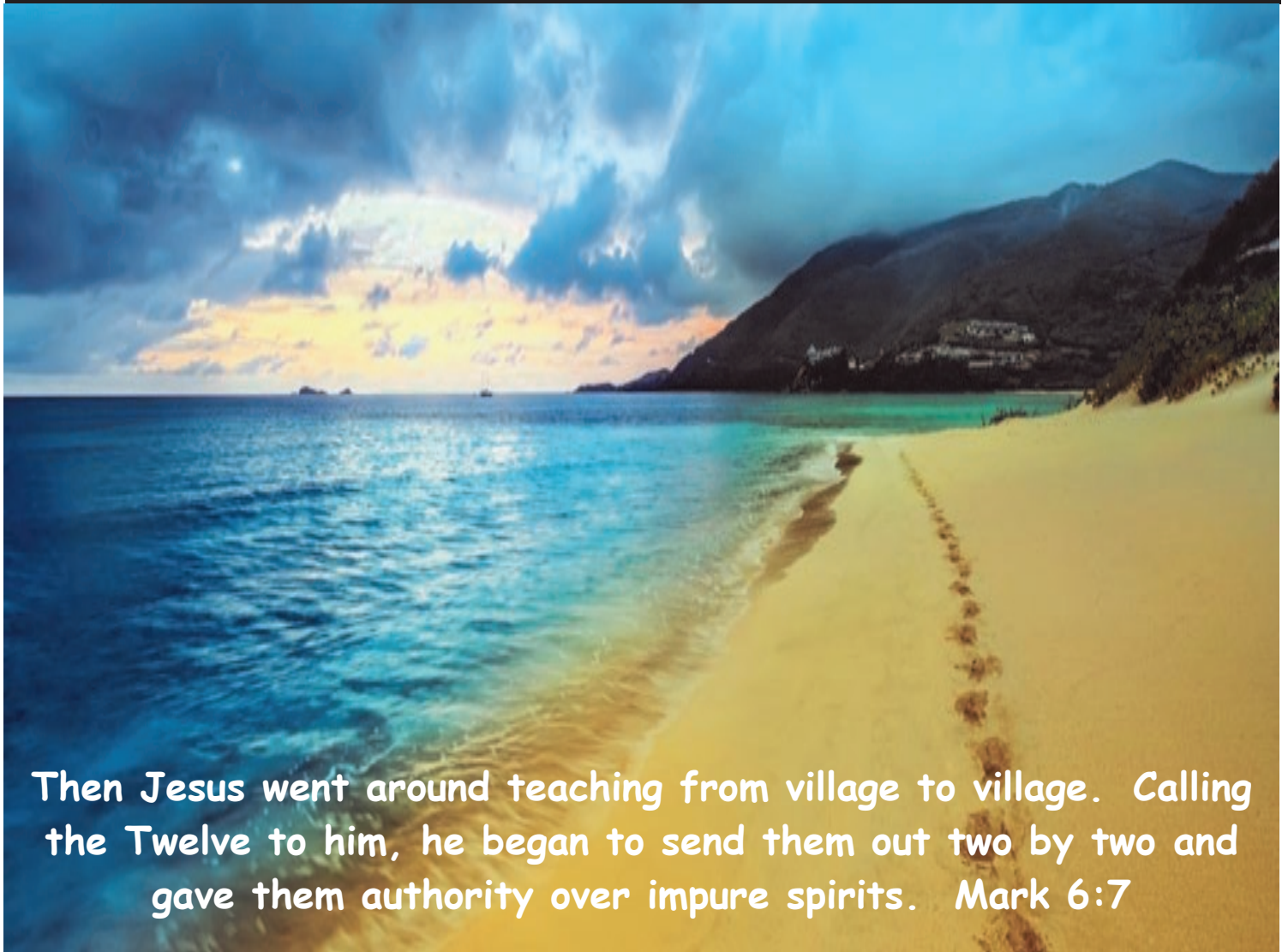

DEACON'S CORNER

Q. Deacon Mike, could Christianity be anything different without the crucifixion?

A. To be sure, Christianity could be anything God wanted it to be, even without a crucifixion. For example, God could have just sent His Son to be a great teacher in the hope that mankind would change their ways. Jesus could have taught a different type of Christianity. But, that is all in the realm of speculation—grist for the mill of the "Ivory Tower types." You know, the kind of people who have nothing better to do with their time except to sit around and 'pontificate' why their theories are better than God's. We, on the other hand, are concerned with facts. And, as the facts stand, Christianity could not be shorn of the crucifixion. In fact, all of Judaism up to the time of Jesus pointed to a Messiah who would die a horrible death for the salvation of the world. All of the sacrifices from Adam to Christ were prefigures of the crucifixion. Abraham's willingness to offer Isaac predicted God's willingness to offer His Son. Any value in the Old Testament sacrifices was derived by anticipation of the cross. God willed that the scales of justice had to be balanced, and for that a man had to die for the sins of mankind. Since the infinite majesty of God had been offended, the human being chosen to expiate this infinite offense must be of infinite dignity.
