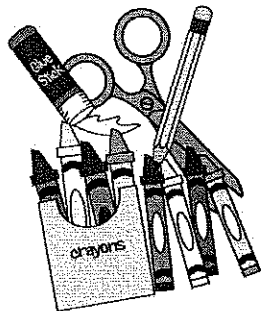

Reading/ELA:

Learning to read is a lot like learning to ride a bicycle- practice makes perfect! During the summer it is very important for your child to continue to use newly acquired reading and writing skills. 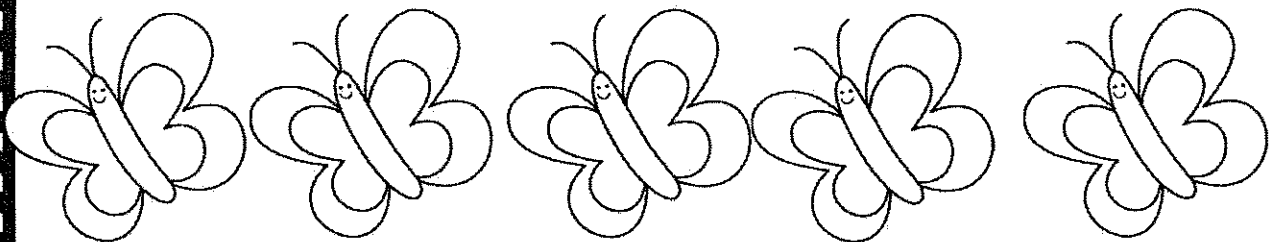
Color 2 butterflies



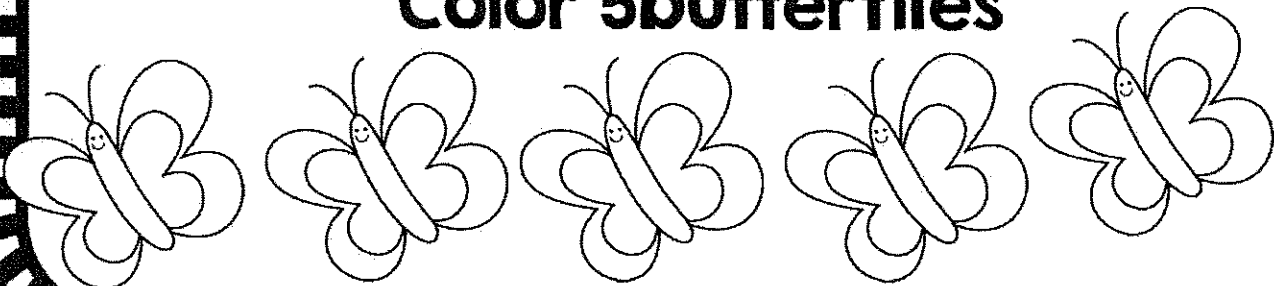
