REFLECTION

Living in the Future in the Present

The last three Sundays of the year invite us to look into the future. Though we are accustomed to think of the close of the Liturgical Year as the end, it is really an opening into the end-time, into the future. Each of the remaining Sundays flashes a spotlight of some aspect of what God is doing in preparation for this future. Today's Bible passages lead us to look at the question of resurrection and the manner of life we are to live in anticipation of it. The Sadducees insisted on understanding the next life as if it were merely a continuation of the present one. Jesus corrected this error in his answer to them. Jesus does not say what the future life will be like. He simply states that it will be different. The method of assuring the continuation of life will be radically transformed. What is clear is the assurance that our relation with God will continue. If this is the future that awaits us, how are we to live until it dawns on us? In fact, our future is already present by the grace given us from God through our Lord Jesus Christ. We are therefore called to live lives that have been radically transformed. We live both in this age and in the age to come. We live future lives, but we live them in the present. When we live lives of the future, we truly enable that future to dawn on us in the present.
