Faith Over Fear

Today's Gospel complements the first reading from Job as it shares the same marine scenario. Just as the unequalled power of God is revealed to Job through the soliloquy concerning the origin and the ordering of the sea, so is Jesus revealed as a sharer in the very power of God. Like God, who created the sea, Jesus has power to set its limits and calm its fearsome fury. The Gospel reading concludes dramatically with the disciples asking, "Who is this whom even wind and sea obey?" The Gospel answers that question. Jesus is Master of the Sea.

REFLECTION

Job 38:1, 8-11 Psalm 107
2 Corinthians 5:14-17 Mark 4:35-41

Why Are You Terrified? Do You Not Yet Have Faith?

“Who can this be that the wind and the sea obey him?” This question voiced by the awestruck disciples has an obvious answer. Considered in the light of today’s first reading from Job, wherein the Lord God is shown to enjoy unique power and control over the frightening and foreboding sea, it seems quite clear Jesus, who is shown here as exercising a similar power and control over the stormy sea of Galilee, is being presented as on a par with God.

Taking a cue from Jesus’ own words to his frightened disciples, we become aware of this Gospel’s challenge to our faith. Although there shall be times in the life of the Church (i.e. the “bark of Peter”) that will threaten us with forces of chaos and confusion, no force, however frightening, will prove to be a match for the power and presence of God in the person of Jesus Christ. To cope with the chaos and maintain an even keel despite the turbulence of the times, we, like Jesus’ earliest disciples, are invited to cultivate a strong and unwavering faith. Such faith will not yield to any fear or shrink from any threat.
