Take To Heart These Words

The readings for this Sunday all cluster around one central theme: the covenant in the lives of the people. The originator of the covenant is God, the one, holy God; the mediator of the covenant is Jesus Christ, the high priest; and the essence of the covenant is love.

It has been said that falling in love with God is the central act of the religious person. It certainly is the essence of the covenant. We are to love with all our heart and all our soul and all our strength; we are to love God and to love others. Love is as fundamental to human nature as the sun is to the earth, and yet it is so difficult. If only we could fall in love with God; if only we would see in each other the image that God loves so passionately. Then we too would be close to the reign of God.
