Ascension of the Lord

"So then the Lord Jesus, after he spoke to them, was taken up into heaven and took his seat at the right hand of God."

At the Ascension, which we will celebrate again on Sunday, Jesus leaves the Apostles with this missionary mandate: "Go into the whole world and proclaim the Gospel to every creature. Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved; whoever does not believe will be condemned."

We have been baptized in the faith, but we need to grow in our faith until the day we die. We either swim upstream to heaven or float downstream to hell. There is no standing still!

THREE WAYS TO HOLD ONTO FAITH UNTIL THE END

Faith is a theological virtue freely given at Baptism. Faith is believing in God even though we do not see Him. Faith must be defended, cultivated and shared with others if faith is to persevere in our lives.

Do you still have faith?

Jesus said: "When the Son of man comes many will lose faith and charity will grow cold in many hearts." If you still have faith, be exceedingly thankful for this precious and gratuitous gift. Maybe it would be a good spiritual exercise to simply wind back the clock and see how many practiced the faith with you—maybe many of your relatives. Now, for some reason, many of these same people do not have faith, but you do!

1. A DYNAMIC, VIBRANT AND GROWING PRAYER LIFE

The late Father John Hardon, S.J. made this observation: "Those who lost their faith often were those who abandoned the practice of prayer." That makes sense. Why? For this simple reason: praying is an act of Faith.

Every day of our life, we should strive to pray a little bit more and better. This indeed will be a safeguard to help us avoid losing our faith.

2. BEGGARS BEFORE THE LORD

Why not pray this short but powerful prayer: "Lord, I believe, but strengthen my belief." Jesus told us: "Ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened." (Mt. 7:7) We should never be afraid to become a beggar before the Lord, imploring Him to give us a robust and dynamic faith!

3. STUDY

Venerable Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen once commented that very few people leave the faith for what the Church teaches, but rather for what they think the Church teaches. In other words, many leave the Church and lose their faith based on erroneous concepts of Church teaching. Due to an all-pervasive ignorance, a lack of knowledge of Divine truths combined with poor catechesis, many abandon the practice of the faith.

If you want to grow in your faith and avoid losing it, then you must study your faith. One suggestion: read, study, and learn the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

TRES MANERAS DE MANTENER LA FE HASTA EL FIN

La fe es una virtud teológica que se da gratuitamente en el Bautismo. La fe es creer en Dios aunque no lo veamos. La fe debe ser defendida, cultivada y compartida con otros para que la fe persevere en nuestras vidas.

¿Aún conserva la fe?

Jesús dijo: "Cuando venga el Hijo del hombre muchos perderán la fe y la caridad se enfriará en muchos corazones". Si todavía tienes fe, agradece enormemente este don precioso y gratuito. Tal vez sería un buen ejercicio espiritual simplemente retroceder en el tiempo y ver cuántos practicaron la fe con usted, tal vez muchos de sus familiares. Ahora, por alguna razón, muchas de esas mismas personas no tienen fe, ¡pero tú sí!

1. UNA VIDA DE ORACIÓN DINÁMICA, VIBRANTE Y CRECIENTE

El padre John Hardon, S.J., ya fallecido, hizo esta observación: "Los que pierden su fe suelen ser los que dejan de practicar la oración". Es lógico. ¿Por qué? Por esta sencilla razón: rezar es un acto de fe.

Cada día de nuestra vida, debemos esforzarnos por rezar un poco más y mejor. Esto sí que será una salvaguarda que nos ayudará a no perder la fe.

2. MENDIGOS ANTE EL SEÑOR

Haz esta corta pero poderosa oración: "Señor, creo, pero fortalece mi creencia". Jesús nos dijo: "Pedid y recibiréis; buscad y encontraréis; llamad y se os abrirá la puerta". (Mt. 7:7) ¡Nunca debemos tener miedo de convertirnos en mendigos ante el Señor, implorándole que nos dé una fe robusta y dinámica!

3. ESTUDIAR

El Venerable Arzobispo Fulton J. Sheen comentaba en una ocasión que muy pocas personas abandonan la fe por lo que la Iglesia enseña, sino por lo que creen que la Iglesia enseña. O sea, que muchos abandonan la Iglesia y pierden la fe basándose en conceptos erróneos de la enseñanza de la Iglesia. Debido a una ignorancia generalizada, una falta de conocimiento de las verdades divinas combinada con una mala catequesis, muchos abandonan la práctica de la fe.

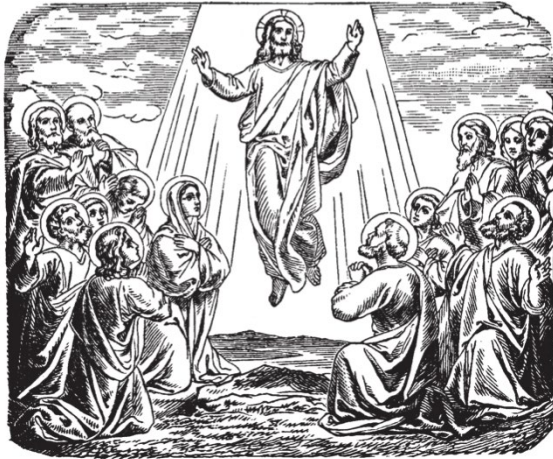
