

Did you know?**Talking about stranger danger**

The idea of “stranger danger” is often too broad a concept for children to grasp as not all strangers are dangerous, and children will always be meeting new people and on occasion may need to ask a stranger for help. Instead of issuing a blanket warning, try these tips for keeping children safe around people they do not know. If an unknown adult approaches them, have them check with a parent or known and trusted adult before engaging in conversation. This can be as simple as a quick look to the parent followed by a nod indicating that it is okay to interact. As an adult yourself, you can set a good example by talking first to parents, then to children in their care. This helps your own children see how trustworthy adults engage with children around their parents and helps them learn caution for adults who do not act in the same way. Hablar del peligro de los extraños

La idea de “peligro de un extraño” es a menudo un concepto demasiado amplio para que los niños la comprendan, ya que no todos los extraños son peligrosos y los niños siempre conocerán gente nueva y, en ocasiones, es posible que necesiten pedir ayuda a un extraño. En lugar de emitir una advertencia general, pruebe estos consejos para mantener seguros a los niños cuando están cerca de personas que no conocen. Si un adulto desconocido se les acerca, pídeles que le pregunten a uno de sus padres o a un adulto conocido y de confianza si puede entablar una conversación con esa persona. Esto puede ser tan simple como una mirada rápida a los padres seguida de un asentimiento que indica que está bien interactuar. Usted mismo, como adulto, puede dar un buen ejemplo hablando primero con los padres de familia y luego con los niños bajo su cuidado. Esto ayuda a sus propios hijos a ver cómo los adultos confiables se relacionan con los niños alrededor de sus padres y les ayuda a aprender a ser cautelosos con los adultos que no actúan de la misma manera. **Mini-Catechism:
The Creation of the Angels****1. What is an angel?**

An angel is a spirit who does not have a body. That is why we cannot perceive them with our senses, just like the human soul, or the essence of God. An angel is a person. He has knowledge and free will. He thus is free to love and receive love.

An angel is immortal. He was created by God, but will never die. An angel is far more intelligent and powerful than any human being in this world.

2. Who is the angel who helps me?

The angel who helps me is my guardian angel. He loves me. He keeps me from danger. He helps me to think of God. I am to listen to him and obey him. “See that you despise not one of these little ones, for I say to you that their angels in heaven always look upon the face of my heavenly father.” (Matthew 18:10)

“Besides each believer stands an angel as protector and shepherd leading him to life.” (St Basil, cited in the CCC, #336)

3. How many angels are there?

Concerning the number of angels, the book of Daniel says, “thousands upon thousands were ministering to Him, and myriads upon myriads attended Him.” (Daniel 7:10)

4. How do we know that angels exist?

God has revealed to us that they exist through the Church. The angels are mentioned about 300 times in the Bible. The angels are often mentioned in the Church’s official prayer called the liturgy.

5. What do the angels do?

They worship God; and they serve Christ and the Blessed Virgin in the work of our salvation. They want to help us to reach heaven. They are present every time we celebrate Mass. We join them to adore God.

Lucifer and the Devils**6. Who are devils?**

Devils are bad angels. God created them good. They made themselves bad by sin, which is disobedience to God.

7. How did the devils’ sin?

All the angels underwent a trial. It was revealed to them that the Son of God, the Second Person of the Holy Trinity, was going to become man, and that they would have to serve human beings. “Those who would become the greatest among you must become the servants of the rest.” (Matthew 20:27) Humans are naturally inferior to angels. Filled with pride, Lucifer, which means “Carrier of Light,” rebelled. He, the most beautiful of the angels, and his followers refused to serve. He said, “We will not serve. We will not obey.”

8. Who is St Michael the Archangel?

Michael, whose name means “Who is like God”, arose to fight for God. With God’s power, he and the other good angels cast Lucifer and the bad angels into hell. From beautiful and attractive angels filled with peace and light, Lucifer and the bad angels became ugly and repulsive creatures filled with darkness and despair.

“War broke out in heaven. Michael and his angels battled against the dragon. The dragon and its angels fought back, but they did not prevail and there was no longer a place for them in heaven.” (Revelation 12: 7-9)
