Honoring children's boundaries teaches important lessons about consent

As we enter into the holiday season, where many of us will spend time with extended family and friends, parents should remember to pay attention to their children's comfort levels, especially when it comes to physical affection. We want our children to be kind and considerate, so it is tempting to ask them to give hugs and kisses to family members and friends. But when children are nervous or shy, or just do not want to, it is important to honor their personal boundaries — and it teaches them a great lesson about consent over who interacts with them and their bodies. On the last Sunday of each liturgical year, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Christ the King.

Pope Pius XI instituted this feast in 1925 with his encyclical *Quas Primas* (“In the first”) to respond to growing nationalism and secularism. He recognized that these related societal ills would breed increasing hostility against the Church. His encyclical reminds the faithful that while governments and philosophies come and go, Christ reigns as king forever.

The Kingdom Demands Discipleship

We must work every day, with the help of the Holy Spirit, to draw closer to Jesus. In our own increasingly “post-Christian” society, we cannot be complacent in our spiritual lives. To acknowledge the kingship of Christ means that we should dedicate ourselves to prayer, to building up our families and our parish communities, and to bringing healing to a broken world.

The Kingdom is Humble

Jesus inaugurates a kingdom that grows through humble acts of service. Even as her freedom to carry out her ministries is threatened, the Church must patiently continue to serve the poor, educate the young, welcome the migrant, visit the prisoner, heal the sick, bury the dead, and love others.

Solemnidad de Cristo Rey

El último domingo de cada año litúrgico, la Iglesia celebra la Solemnidad de Cristo Rey.

El Papa Pío XI instituyó esta fiesta en 1925 con su encíclica Quas Primas ("En primer lugar") para responder al creciente nacionalismo y secularismo. Reconoció que estos males sociales relacionados engendrarían una creciente hostilidad contra la Iglesia. Su encíclica recuerda a los fieles que mientras los gobiernos y las filosofías van y vienen, Cristo reina como rey para siempre.

El Reino exige discipulado

Debemos trabajar cada día, con la ayuda del Espíritu Santo, para acercarnos a Jesús. En nuestra sociedad cada vez más "postcristiana", no podemos ser complacientes en nuestra vida espiritual. Reconocer la realeza de Cristo significa que debemos dedicarnos a la oración, a construir nuestras familias y nuestras comunidades parroquiales, y a llevar la curación a un mundo roto.

El reino es humilde

Jesús inaugura un reino que crece a través de humildes actos de servicio. Incluso cuando su libertad para llevar a cabo sus ministerios se ve amenazada, la Iglesia debe continuar pacientemente sirviendo a los pobres, educando a los jóvenes, acogiendo a los emigrantes, visitando a los presos, curando a los enfermos, enterrando a los muertos y amando a los demás.
