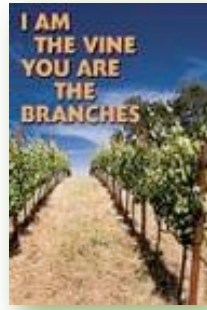

So as I am now less affected by everything that is different about what is going on around me, I am able to see just how the same our faith has made us. I was struck while listening to the choir singing the responses in their native Runnir that these were the same responses being sung in Niceville, Florida on the other side of the world. Not only the same responses, but the same Mass. The same Body and Blood. We are all together in the Eucharist.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

A 7.8-magnitude earthquake struck Nepal in the late morning of April 25 just 50 miles northwest of the capital, Kathmandu, toppling buildings and homes, causing widespread panic, and so far claiming more than 5,200 lives. The devastation and toll on human life is still becoming clear as rescue workers access the affected areas and populations.

The earthquake struck the Kathmandu valley, which is densely populated with nearly 2.5 million people. Kathmandu's streets and squares are covered in rubble and many are feared trapped in collapsed buildings. Many buildings, including historic sites, are destroyed or unsafe. Tens of thousands of families are sleeping outside in Kathmandu and require shelter and protection from the cold and relentless rain, which has worsened conditions. Aftershocks continue - one reaching 6.7 magnitude and another 5.4 magnitude - increasing fear, causing further damage to buildings, and interrupting rescue operations. Most markets in Kathmandu are closed.

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops and Catholic Relief Services (CRS) are providing 10,000 families (50,000 people) with emergency shelter materials, blankets, water treatment and hygiene kits. Given the scale of the disaster, we expect to expand relief activities to additional families. CRS is working with Caritas Nepal to identify the most pressing needs in the hardest hit districts between Kathmandu and Pokhara, and will scale our operations accordingly.

Therefore, I am asking that a Special Collection be taken up to assist the efforts of Catholic Relief Services in Nepal. I also ask that you continue to pray for those whose lives, homes, families and communities have suffered deeply from this disaster. While they need our material help they also greatly need our spiritual support and prayers.

Knowing your great generosity in the past, I thank you in advance for your response as our brothers and sisters urgently struggle to rebuild their lives and cling to the hope their faith gives them.

Before setting a Wedding Date:

 ➤ Schedule appointment with Pastor
SIX MONTHS in ADVANCE of anticipated Wedding Date
 ➤ To be married in Catholic Church by a Catholic priest **registration & completion** of prep program required

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Prior to setting a Baptism date:

Call the parish office at 897-7797:
 ➤ to register for required class
 ➤ to complete necessary paperwork
 One of the godparents:
 ➤ must be baptized & confirmed
 ➤ a practicing Catholic who is sixteen years of age or older
