Fasting & Abstinence

GOOD FRIDAY ~ MARCH 25th**FASTING** is to be observed by all who are 18 years of age and

older and who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. **On a fast day:** one full meal is allowed; two other meals, according to one's needs, but not to equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk & juice are okay.

ABSTINENCE observed by all 14 years of age and older. Days of abstinence no meat is allowed. *Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.*

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

A few years ago after creating a few painted backdrops for our youth ministry, I was approached by Deacon Jim Murray with a suggestion that I paint something special for Easter. I was honored to do so, and took the idea further by not only doing triptych of the Empty Tomb that will be on display in the Narthex for the Easter season, but also another trio of panels that would be up for just one night, Holy Thursday, and displayed in the chapel for Adoration. It is the latter that I will speak of here.

The Garden of Gethsemane was a work of prayer. I, as the painter do not claim it to be any great work, nor do I think of myself as an artist per se, but rather just someone who likes to paint. With that being said, these paintings are precious to me, and over the years others have shared with me that they have found a special place in their hearts for them as well. So their true beauty lies in the fact that they were prayed into being, the Holy Spirit was my guide, and my hands were simply His instrument.

In hopes of enhancing your prayer experience as you pass through or stay and spend some time before the Tabernacle on Holy Thursday, I would like to give some explanation to what the images are and about the symbolism used. The left panel is dark and bleak with the figure of satan. Why satan you may wonder? He would have been there in the garden watching with great interest, doing his best to tempt Christ away from being the Savior of all humanity. The right panel shows sleeping disciples who could not stay awake even for one hour. For the center panel, I chose not to actually paint a figure of Christ, but to use symbolism instead. I felt that Christ was present already in the form of the Eucharist and that symbolism would give us all more to contemplate as we “stayed awake” with Him. The center panel features a tree unlike any of the other many trees in the complete work. This tree is the largest and it bends and “weeps” as Christ did for humanity. I also imagined Christ leaning His arms on this tree as He prayed to the Father, so there is a bright area on the tree and this area is reflected in a small pool of water on the ground. Though there is no chalice on the tree (only a bright spot), there is a chalice in the reflection. In this pool we have the chalice pouring out wine, and thus we have wine mixed with water—the precious blood of Jesus Christ spilled for our redemption.

The paintings were done in a rather cold garage which I kept quite dark since I wanted to paint in the same light they would be seen in, and they took many long hours of standing, laying on the dirty floor, and climbing up and down the ladder. The light and warmth I felt while painting them, however, far outweighed any discomfort. I pray that light and warmth will shine in all of you this Easter season.
