In light of a recent credible allegation of inappropriate contact with a minor involving Fr. Edward Jones, which occurred fourteen years ago, the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee encourages anyone who may have been abused by any clergy person, employee or volunteer in ministry with the Church, or who knows of such abuse, to contact local law enforcement or the Florida Abuse Hotline at 1-800-96-ABUSE (1-800-962-2873) or the Chancellor of the diocese at 850-435-3520.

The Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee is committed to healing the hurting hearts of sexual abuse victims and has established Victim's Assistance Coordinators who are experienced and trained counselors available to help persons who have been sexually abused. Please pray for all victims of abuse, as well as for our Church leaders. Let us recall Jesus' words at the end of the Gospel of Matthew: "Behold, I am with you always, even until the end of the world!"
